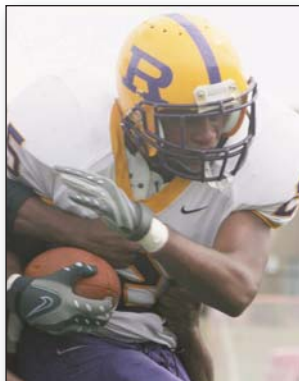

Sirianni Honored after Big Win

Southwestern coach Jay Sirianni has been named the Buffalo Bills Coach of the Week after his Trojans clinched the C South Division with a 27-20 win over Fredonia last week-end.

Both team entered the game undefeated and ranked in the Top Ten in New York State.

"The league championship was on the line and it was a big game," Sirianni said. "We told the kids to take advantage of the opportunity. All eyes in Western New York were on this game so we told them to enjoy the moment and leave it all on the field."

Southwestern jumped out early and led 27-6 but Fredonia scored on last play of the half to make it 27-13.

"That was a big play," Sirianni said. "That score really got Fredonia back in the game. We had some opportunities

in the second half but didn't score. We made enough plays to win."

John Mistretta led the ground attack as he rushed for over 100 yards and a TD.

The Trojans also played the second half without QB Jim Rauh who left the game with a shoulder injury at the end of the first half. Rauh completed 6 of 7 passes for 166 yards and 3 TDs before he was injured.

"Losing our quarterback really hurt," Sirianni said, "He finished the first half but he couldn't come back."

Rauh is questionable to play next week.

Jake Swan moved from wide receiver to quarterback for the second half. Swan had caught 3 passes for 140 yards and 2 TDs before moving to QB.

"Jake did a nice job" Sirianni said. "We moved the ball, we just didn't score."

The victory is the 35th straight for Southwestern, though Sirianni downplayed the streak.

"We've won six in a row," he said.

"This year's team is 6-0."

Fredonia may have given the Trojans their stiffest test throughout the winning streak.

"They are all tough," Sirianni said. "It's not easy to win football games but we really had to earn this one."

Sirianni, who played quarterback at Southwestern, was a back-up quarterback at Mount Union when the team won the national championship in 1996.

Sirianni's older brother, Mike, is the head coach at Washington & Jefferson while his younger brother Nick is an offensive assistant with the Kansas City Chiefs.

He has coached Southwestern since 2003 and led the Trojans to four league titles, three Section 6 titles and two New York State championships.

He started his coaching career as an assistant at Maple Grove before moving on to Alfred University. He also coached at Arunbel HS in Maryland before returning to Southwestern as the Trojans head coach.

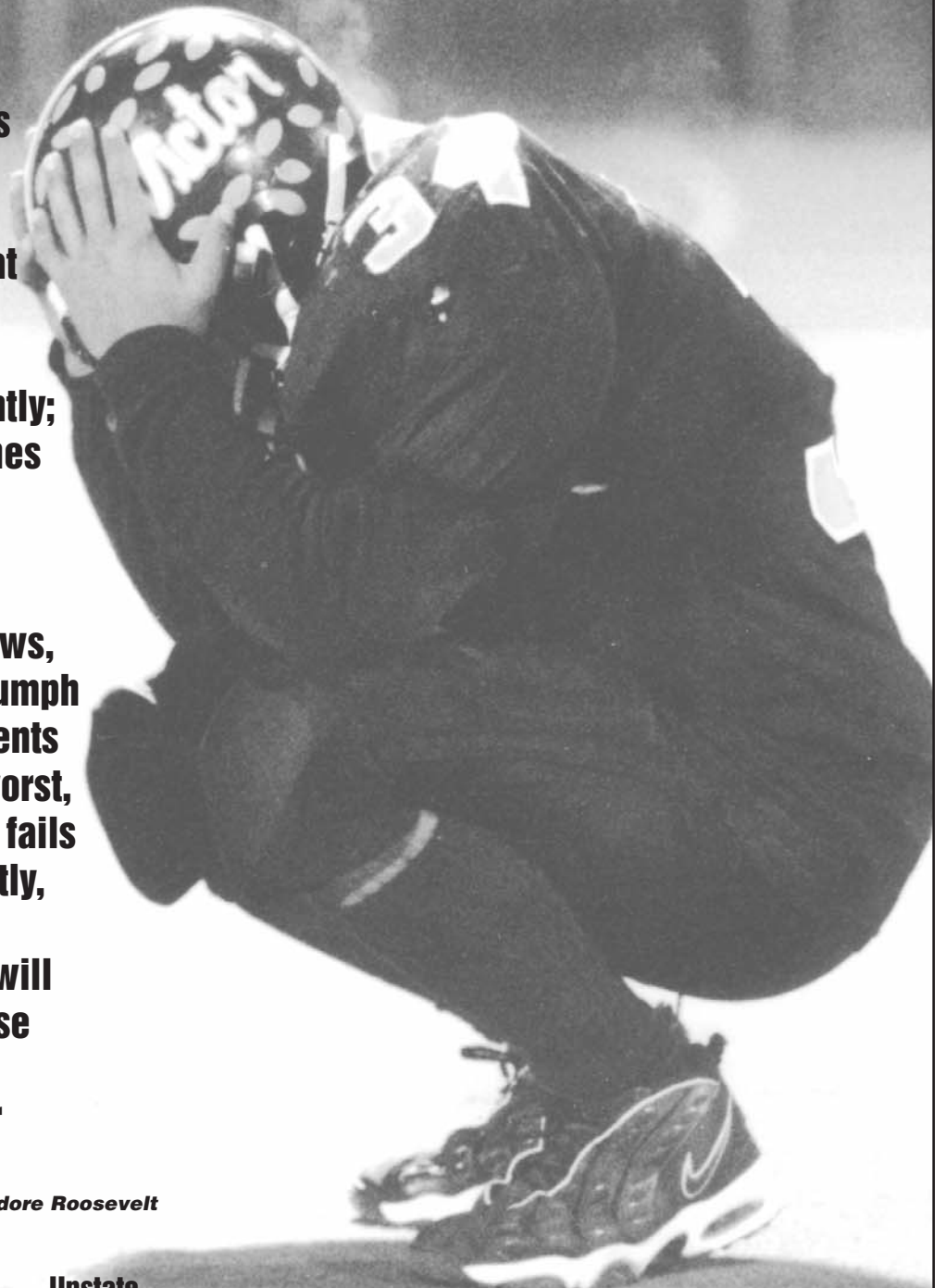

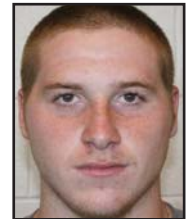


Players of the Week

Kenmore West Is Best?

Kenmore West beat arch-rival Kenmore East 40-12 last weekend in the schools' annual Neighborhood grudge match.

"It's a rivalry game," Kenmore West coach Rich Harris said. "The kids look forward to it all year and will remember it for the rest of their lives."

The Blue Devils led 14-6 at the half but exploded for four touchdowns in the third quarter to blow the game wide open.

"I think we had a little bit of nerves," Harris said. "We went into the game as heavy favorites. The kids knew they were supposed to win. They were just jittery and we made some mistakes."

Harris said that he was calm during the halftime discussion.

"I just told them to settle down and do what we do," he said. "Our kids came out and totally dominated the third quarter."

The running game was in high gear as Martin Bailey rushed for 97 yards and 2 TDs while QB Marcus Lobdell ran for 100 yards and 2 TDs yards.

Kenmore West will now play for the Class AA North Division title when the Blue Devils host Riverside this weekend.

"Either team will win the division with a win," Harris said. "It's a true title game."

Kenmore West last won the AA North championship in 2000 under head coach Jerry Tutweiler.

"I was an assistant with Jerry," Harris said. "That's back when it was just four teams making the playoffs."

Harris says that the 10-year gap between division titles is misleading.

"We lost to the eventual state champion in the playoffs," Harris said. "We've run into some pretty good opponents. No one thinks of us as a powerhouse but we have been right there."

Last season, Kenmore West missed the playoffs as Harris was rebuilding the roster and the Blue Devils started 0-5. Harris finally switched Lobdell from WR to quarterback and the Devils won three of their final four games.

"His first game as a starting quarterback was against Lockport," Harris said. "We lost but he had a

real good day passing. Marcus went 3-2 as a sophomore QB and it turned our season around."

Harris says that he was excited when Lobdell joined the program before his sophomore season.

"He had played in the spread offense as a freshman at St. Joe's before he transferred over here," Harris said. "Coming into camp, he was a sophomore and I took him right up to the varsity."

Halfway through the season, with the Devils at 0-4 and out of the playoffs, Harris installed Lobdell at the quarterback position.

"We were trying to build for the following season," he said. "We thought he would be a real threat in the option offense but it took a few weeks for him to get some confidence."

Lobdell is an extremely athletic quarterback.

"He's an outstanding basketball player," Harris said. "He's a 6-foot high jumper and participated in the Empire State games. He's a very athletic kid."

"He's very intelligent," Harris said. "He sees the defense and understands the offense."

Ken West lost to Clarence in the championship game of the Class A Bowl Tournament.

"We played a great game that night but Clarence beat us," Harris said. "I still felt pretty good about how we ended. We knew we had some nice athletes coming back and some good kids coming up from the JV team."

Harris says he felt even better during the off-season and at the start of practice in August.

"I knew coming out of the scrimmage that we were a pretty good football team," he said.

Kenmore West opened the 2010 season with a win over longtime nemesis North Tonawanda. But the days immediately following the win brought trouble.

"We lost our focus," Harris said. "Not just physically but mentally. I was coach of the week, there were TV cameras in practice and the kids were giddy. Then we lost to Niagara Falls. That was a real lesson learned. We need to stay grounded and keep working hard."

"He had close to 50 goals in lacrosse last year," Tundo said. "He's being recruited by some big lacrosse programs, too."

Johnson also maintains an academic average of 95.

"You couldn't ask for a better student," Tundo said. "He's a team player and he's a playmaker."

"He's a great kid who works hard," Zipp said. "He's tough and can take the hits inside. With his smarts and his work ethic, he's a great player to have."

Bomasuto Nears 1,000 Yards

Out of the Darkness

Javeon Tomlinson rids himself of demons, focuses on success

Lockport lost Riverside 23-16 in OT last weekend. Despite the loss, the Lions clinched a playoff spot when Niagara Falls lost the following day.

If the Lions beat Williamsville North this weekend, they will earn a home game in the first round of the AA playoffs.

Javeon Tomlinson has become an important part of Lockport's drive to the playoffs.

"Javeon is very fast," Bronson said. "He's is a sprinter on track team. He is deceptively strong and gets into weight room quite a bit. He is becoming more confident in his ability as he has matured."

Tomlinson earned a starting role at defensive end during the pre-season.

But no matter how Lockport's season ends, Javeon may have already won something far more important than a football championship.

"I tell you what," Bronson said. "He's done a heck of a job with his life. He was certainly headed down that statistical pathway to nowhere."

Tomlinson has had demons chasing him for years. He was just 10 when he witnessed his father's murder in his family's own driveway.

"My dad and I were very close," Javeon said. "He always wanted me to play football."

What Javeon and his mother Shelia did not know was that Daniel Tomlinson, who had moved to the United States from Jamaica in 19XX, had another part of his life that they were not privy too.

"My father was involved in some illegal activities," Javeon said. "We had no idea about any of it."

Shelia was stunned when her husband was arrested for marijuana and weapons possession in December of 2002.

"I spent 20 years of my life with this person," Sheila said. "I

was never even aware of this. It really took our family for loop."

On July 29, 2003, eight months after his arrest, Donald was outside working on a new car that the family had just purchased.

"I was watching a movie but something told me to go outside," Javeon said. "Two minutes later, a man came walking up our driveway and shot my father."

The man shot Daniel point-blank in the face - in front of Shelia and all three of the Tomlinson children.

"I was so close I had gunpowder on my face," Shelia said. "I was screaming and the man kept shooting him."

After the initial chaos, more news about Daniel began to trickle out to the community.

Lockport police believe that Daniel Tomlinson had ties with a local group of Jamaicans who were importing marijuana.

No one has ever been charged in Daniel's murder and the case is now in the Cold Case files at the

Lockport Police Department. It is suspected that anyone connected with the crime has left the country and the chances of ever solving it are slim.

The immediate aftermath was a nightmare.

"We had to leave the country," Shelia said. "We went to Jamaica to get away from everything. Daniel is buried there." Shelia tried to focus on her children while trying to regain her footing.

"My life had changed forever," Shelia said. "Overnight, our financial situation had changed drastically. I was suddenly responsible for three young people and I was all alone."

Javeon's sister, Ikea, and his brother, O'Brian, both

seemed to deal with the tragedy. They were both top-notch students at Lockport High School and are now in college and working toward degrees.

But Javeon struggled.

"He was 10," Shelia said. "Javeon and his dad were very close. He would constantly ask me questions that I had no answers for."

Around the age of 15, Javeon's anger and despair began to bubble to the surface.

"I had a very negative attitude about everything," Javeon said. "I had fights. My grades went down."

Finally, about a year ago, Javeon was arrested and spent two nights in jail.

"Javeon has had a rough go of it," Bronson said. "His anger, his behavior and way of dealing with things were all very disruptive. When he got arrested, we took him off the team and he did not finish the season with us."

Bronson was worried about Tomlinson.

"We were all very concerned," Bronson said. "Javeon was volatile. He was angry. But, no matter how you feel about a kid, at that moment, you can't keep him on the team."

Throughout the remainder of the season, Shelia stayed in contact with Bronson.

"She said that Javeon needed football," Bronson said. "He needed to be involved with something that was good for him. Something that runs all year round."

The two nights in jail may have been a blessing.

"The other people I was around in the jail," Javeon said, "I didn't even understand the things they were talking about. I just wasn't raised that way. I knew I needed to change."

Javeon emerged from jail a different person. A light had gone on and he was ready to drop the anger.

"I got home and just realized that being stuck in the past won't get you anywhere," he said. "I knew the statistics. I knew that I was supposed to fail. I wanted to prove people wrong."

Bronson opened the door for Javeon to return to the team.

"As soon as the season ended, he re-joined us and showed up to the off-season workouts on a regular basis," Bronson said. "He really seemed determined to do whatever was necessary to participate and contribute. We've given him every opportunity and he's truly taken advantage of it."

Javeon says that football has given him focus.

"Football gave me discipline," he said. "It gave me respect, commitment, leadership. Football has been very good for me."

Javeon says he very much wants to play in Ralph Wilson Stadium. Such an ending to the season would truly be a reward for working so hard to change his own path.

"I dealt with what I had to deal with," Tomlinson said. "I enjoy every day now, stress free."

Both Javeon and Shelia feel badly that Daniel is only remembered for being murdered.

"He was on his way to Niagara University that fall," Shelia said. "He wanted to become an Electronic Engineer. Nobody knows that about him."

Javeon now has an academic average in the high 80s and is hoping to attend college. His behavior has been exemplary since he left the jail.

"He's definitely a different person since that time," Bronson said. "Without a doubt, he's been a very good player and a very positive force on our team."
