



Gilbert Honored for St. Joe's

St. Joe's head coach Dennis Gilbert has been named the Buffalo Bills' Coach of the Week after his Marauders

beat arch-rival Canisius 34-20 last weekend.

Nigel Davis returned the opening kickoff 85 yards to give St. Joe's a quick 7-0 lead. Canisius never caught St. Joe's.

On the next offensive series, the Marauders stuffed Canisius on a fourth-and-4. St. Joe's took over on its own 42 and used a hook-and-lateral from Kelly to Yanni Zulia to Davis for 27 yards.

On the next play, QB Chad Kelly ran 31 yards for a TD and 14-0 lead just 3:50 into the game.

Davis finished the day with 126 combined yards rushing and receiving while scoring a rushing TD. He also intercepted a pass.

St. Joe's now leads the storied rivalry 46-30-3 against Canisius.

"This is the most important game on our schedule," Gilbert said. "I spoke to 6 of the guys who graduated from last year's team. There were four guys on our sidelines who played for me in 1988. They come back because it's the Canisius game and it's still important to them."

Gilbert, now in second season as St. Joe's head coach, took over for longtime coach Bob O'Connor.

Gilbert started at QB for O'Connor in 1983 and 1984.

"I got a full dose of Bob, first as a player and then as a coach," Gilbert said. "I learned a ton from him."

Gilbert works as a City of Buffalo Police Officer. He was with the Buffalo Housing Authority for three years before it was shut down in 2005. He took a job working with the New York State Inspector General's Office before joining the Buffalo Police force in 2007.

"I see a lot of bad stuff," he said. "A lot of pain and suffering at times. Seeing blood and death is difficult. But I

Before becoming a police officer, Gilbert managed a bar for several years.

"That was kind of like being a cop," he said with a laugh. "It was wild. You learn a lot about people. Unfortunately, you see people at their worst sometimes."

Gilbert says that coaching football is a huge relief from the stress of being a cop.

"I might go from a homicide scene to football practice," he said, "but I'm invigorated because these kids soak up everything. The passion they have for football makes you feel young again."

Gilbert played three seasons of varsity football at St. Joe's. He graduated in may of 1984 and was named the head JV coach in August of that same year.

"It was interesting to say the least," Gilbert said. "It was fun, it kept me in the game."

Gilbert had planned to play football at Canisius College after graduating from high school.

"I was going to play," he said, "but my dad told me

that I should concentrate on school the first year. My plan was to get my grades up and then play for Canisius. But Bob O'Connor asked me if I wanted to coach at St. Joe's. Once I started coaching, I liked it as much as playing."

Gilbert says he gets the same feeling before a game that he did when he was a player.


"It's a competitive environment," he said. "You spend a lot of time on scouting and preparation. The kids are an extension of you. If they go out and stink, it's your fault. You didn't get them ready. You can be the smartest guy in the world but if you can't get your kids to buy into your program, you aren't any good."

Wowie, Howie!

South Park bounced back from an early deficit and the Sparks earned their first win of the season when they beat Lew-Port 40-7 last weekend.

"We had an awful start," coach Tim Delaney said. "We threw an interception on the first play of the game and they scored three plays later."

South Park trailed 7-0 just minutes into the game but regrouped and scored the next 40 points.

"We've talked about that for a while," he said. "When things go bad, we have to get out of it. We have to find a way to not let it continue."

Delanev said he was encouraged by the Sparks ability to shake off the bad start.

"That has happened with us quite a bit the last two years," he said. "When bad Photo by Mark Adair things happened, we weren't able to get out of it and it snowballed."

Delaney said that much of the problem in 2010 was due to a young lineup that included a freshman, Maurice Howie, starting at quarterback.

"We weren't very good last year," he said. "We showed glimpses, but we couldn't finish games. But we won two of our last three games and started to get some confidence at the end."

In the win over Lew-Port, Howie, now a 5-9, 170-pound sophomore, had his best varsity game as he completed 16 of 25 passes for 319 yards and 4 TDs.

"He's still just a sophomore," Delaney said, "but he started every game as a freshman and threw for 1,000 yards. We expect a lot out of him."

South Park has been far more cometitive this season. The Sparks lost to Class A powerhouse Williamsville South 27-6 and suffered an agonizing last-minute loss to Hamburg 19-18.

Howie earned the starting role at South Park before he was even a high school student.

"We didn't have anyone to play QB," Delaney said. "Maurice came with us to the passing league. He threw 3 passes and he was the starter. He's very coachable. He'll do whatever you ask him to do."

Howie is also a threat to run on every play.

"He has a great first move and can make people miss," Delaney said. "He's not afraid to run somebody over either."




Defense **Marquis Artis - Amherst**

Nigel Gives Canisius Nightmares

St. Joe's beat arch-rival Canisius 34-20 last weekend in the first Msgr. Martin Association game for both teams.

"We had a great week of practice," St. Joe's coach Dennis Gilbert said. "We finished earlier than scripted each day because the kids were so efficient."

Gilbert said he was encouraged by the early dismissals from practice.

"It really showed the focus that the kids had," he said, "and the focus was there all week."

Gilbert also said that his marauders were not overly emotional in the week leading up to the game.

"Last year, there was so much emotion," he said, "because we had lost to them 3 or 4 times in a row and it was really important for them to break that streak and turn the tide in the series back in our direction. This year, they were strictly focused on the task at hand, beating Canisius."

This was the 79th time the teams have played. The Marauders now own a record of 43-30-3 against their most heated rivals.

In this year's game, St.

Joe's got an early spark when sophomore Nigel

Davis exploded through a hole and returned the

Davis exploded through a hole and returned the opening kickoff 85 yards for a touchdown.

"His nickname is Nightmare," Gilbert said. "He's a super kid; very quiet and doesn't say much. We almost take him for granted because he did so much or us as a freshman last year. We expect a lot from him and he's been producing every week."

Gilbert first saw Davis when he was playing in a youth football game against Gilbert's son.

"He broke free with a couple of moves," Gilbert said. "My son tried to run him down and couldn't catch him. I knew right then he was going to be good."

Gilbert was ecstatic when Davis enrolled at St.

Joe's for his freshman year. He immediately moved the 14-year old up to the varsity team.

"He started with us from Day One," Gilbert said.

"At our first practice, our Athletic Director looked at me like I was nuts. I said, 'Just watch'. He was better than most of the varsity kids as a freshman."

Gilbert has had experience with a freshman on the varsity team before.

"Nick Hall was doing the same thing," Gilbert said. "Because Nick had been in that situation, he took Nigel under his wing. It didn't take long for the kids to see he belonged."

The only question Gilbert had was if Davis would shy away from contact with the older, stronger players.

"We scrimmaged Cathedral Prep last year," Gilbert said. "On the second play, he came up from the corner and really put a lick on the halfback. Nigel really put a big stick on him. That answered that question."

Now in his second varsity season, Davis starts at slot receiver but will also move to tailback when the Marauders switch into the I-formation.

He also starts at cornerback on defense as

well as returning kickoffs and punts.

"His skill set is pretty good," Gilbert said. "He makes a move and he's gone. He also has an unbelievable football sense. I think his football knowledge is key."

Davis finished the win over Canisius with 40 yards rushing on just 5 carries. He also caught 4 passes for 86 yards and intercepted a pass on defense.

Gilbert says that even with that performance, Davis is still improving.

"We are three games into his sophomore season," he said. "He is still only 15 years old. He is beginning to play more explosively. He's still learning but he's gotten better each week."



Bronson said Chambers showed his strength on his 77-yard TD run.


"After 20 yards, he was hit," Bronson said. "He put his hand on the ground, recovered and ran."

Crowley's performances have garnered attention throughout the area.


"He has a great grasp of what he's doing," Tundo said. "He's done everything we've asked him to do."





Smith maintains


an academic average of 97, and scored over 1100 on his SAT while



"He's hard-nosed," Diminuco said. "He has deceptive strength and speed. He's a gamer and he loves to play the game."

In 2010, Patterson rushed for 220 yards and 3 TDs while serving as a back-up to Peel.

"He also missed 2 or 3 games with some arthroscopic knee surgery," Diminuco said. "He was injured in Week 4. He missed 3 games and then came back to play in all the playoff games."

Patterson, who is 5-9 and 170-pounds, worked hard in the off-season to make himself better.

"He's bigger and stronger this yea," Diminuco said. "He hit the weights pretty hard and he made himself a lot stronger."

Patterson also has a trait that is rare at the high school level, according to Diminuco.

"He's not a real big kid but he keeps his feet moving on contact," Diminuco said. "Even after a defender hits him he keeps his feet moving. That makes him very tough to bring down. That's tough to teach but you see a lot of the good ones do it."

Patterson also isn't slow by anyone's standards.

"He has good speed," Diminuco said. "It's deceptive. He's broken away for some long runs this year."

While he admits that his goal is to get back to the state tournament this fall, Patterson says that he tries not to think more than one day ahead.

"Right now, I'm just thinking about having good practices," he said. "I want to maintain my running. We have a great line blocking for me and it's working really well right now. I don't think we should change anything."

Patterson was hoping to get out of the gate fast.



Are You Game?

Pop Warner's Boys



John Sopko is in his second year of a major rebuilding project as Springville's head coach. Last year, the Griffins finished 1-8, winning only the final game of the season against a winless Akron team in a Bowl game.

"We've had a few tough years now," Sopko said. "The program has been down for about 8 years now.

This season, the Griffins have made small steps forward. Springville beat Salamanca 21-14 in the opening game of the season. It was the first time the Griffins won their opening game in three years. It was the first win in a home opener since 2005.

"We needed that," Sopko said. "Our JV team won their first game, too. We are moving in right direction."

Springville followed that up with a 12-6 loss to Olean and a 26-19 loss to Pioneer. Both losses were much closer than expected.

"I feel good but the kids aren't happy with a good effort anymore," Sopko said. "They want to win."

While Springville has struggled in recent years, the Griffins are a program

that, arguably, has more history than any other program in Western New York.

"We've had a lot of success and tradition here," Sopko said. "We had winning seasons for 35 years in a row. Springville was undefeated in 1939 and again in 1955. We had good teams through out the 1980s."

The Griffins also won a New York State title in 1993 with NYS Class B Player of the Year Mark Rendell.

But despite the long and storied history, Sopko says, the Griffins connection to their past was broken.

"I don't now how it happened," Sopko said. "I know we've had a lot of upheaval in the district. We've had six Superintendents and three principals in 12 years. We've had a lot of athletic directors. That's a total lack of stability and it affected the football program."

Sopko was quick to point out that the last head coach - Joe Marvin - probably deserved the least amount of blame.

"Joe was really in the wrong place at the wrong time," Sopko said. "It all came to a head when he was there but he really had nothing to do with why we bottomed out. It was just a lack of stability and consistency through the

whole football program."

Sopko says that it didn't used to be that way.

"Mick Nugent was the coach here from the middle of the 1960s until end of 1988 season," Sopko said. "Dwayne Havens and Bob Schlageter were here for 35 years. They started our Little League program and we had a very good relationship with them. Jim Duprey was a JV coach who had a record of 180-6... which is ridiculous. We had a vertical alignment with all the programs. The play calling, the formations, the terminology - all the way down to how the center should grip the football - was the same. Somewhere along the way, we lost that vertical connection."

And so, after Sopko was named the head coach before the 2010 season, he was determined to re-make the connections that had been lost over the last decade.

And that includes reconnecting with the school's football history.

Sopko has become an expert on the most famous coach to ever walk the sidelines at Springville... Pop Warner.

Yes, THAT Pop Warner.



Glenn Scoby Warner moved to Springville when he was 10 years old. In his autobiography, Warner wrote, "During a recess period, we played a crude form of football using a pig bladder."

Pop Warner graduated from the Griffith Institute in 1889.

"Pop Warner actually coached a year of high school football at Springville Griffith Institute," Sopko said. "Pop Warner is

buried less than a mile from the school."

Warner captained his football team at Cornell in 1892. He went on to become one of the most influental and famous coaches EVER. He coached at Georgia, lowa State, Cornell, Pittsburgh, Stanford and Temple. He coached at the Carlisle Indian School with a player named Jim Thorpe.

Along the way, Pop Warner became synonymous with Youth football leagues across the country.

Sopko knows of this tradition... and encourages his players to embrace it.

"Of all the kids in the entire world that play football," he says, "Our kids are the only ones that get to play on Pop Warner's field. It's their identity, it's their heritage and it needs to be respected."

Sopko actually encourages his players to go and visit Pop's grave.

"A couple of kids have been up there," he said. "I think it's important for them to see it and actually have a moment to reflect. It really introduces them to their history. It's something to be proud of."
