Comerford Turning Timon Around

Bishop Timon coach Charlie Comerford was named the Buffalo Bills Coach of the Week after his Tigers held on to beat Williamsville South 21-14 last weekend.

"It was a big game," Comerford said. "There was a lot of interest in it. I thanked Will South coach Kraig Kurzanski for playing us. For a lot of Catholic coaches, it's hard to get a game."

Comerford said that Kurzanski immediately agreed to play Bishop Timon.

"I called Kraig and he said he would love to play us," Comerford said. "He thought it would be great for Western New York football."

Comerford says that he wanted his team to play a top WNY team with the opening in Week 1.

"We will play anyone, anywhere," Comerford said. "As long as I am the coach at Timon, we want to play the best competition we can find. We called Will South because they are the one of the best teams in WNY."

This is Comerford's second season at the helm of the Tigers' program. He was hired after the Tigers finished 2-7 in 2010.

Last fall, in his rookie season as a head coach, Comerford led Timon to a 7-3 record. The Tigers also beat Canisius for the first time in 10 years.

"When I got here," he said, "I saw the kids we had and I knew we could win right away."

Winning at Timon is important to Comerford - for more than just competitive reasons.

Comerford graduated from Timon in 2001.

"Timon has a long history and a great tradition of tough football teams," Comerford said. "It was hard to watch them struggle like they did."

Comerford was also one of the best athletes in Timon history. As a TE on the football team, he helped Timon win the Msgr. Martin Association championship in 1999. He still holds the school records for Most Career Receptions and Most Receptions in a Season. He was named a first-team All-WNY player and a first-team All-State player in both his junior and senior seasons.

Comerford was also a star on the basketball court for Timon.

He was named a first-team All-WNY and a first-team All-State player during his junior and senior seasons. He was also named the Western New York Player of the Year by the *Buffalo News* after the 2001 season as he led Bishop Timon to the New York State Catholic title.

He received several scholarship offers in both sports before accepting a football scholarship at Holy Cross University.

"I had a few basketball offers," he said. "But, I just figured that there weren't too many 6-5 power forwards in college, so I accepted the football offer at Holy Cross. It was a great academic school and it was a good fit for me."

Comerford majored in Religious Studies and minored in Sociology at Holy Cross. Unfortunately, his football career didn't go as well as his academics.

"I blew out my back in my sophomore season," he said. "I had two surgeries and never played again. They tried to move me to wide receiver but I just couldn't do it."

After graduating from college, Comerford lived in Washington D.C. and later in Cleveland.

"I went to law school for a year in Cleveland," he said, "but that really wasn't for me."

While Comerford was away from WNY, he was never far from Timon.

"I would get online to get updates and try to follow them," Comerford said. "It was a little embarrassing to see them struggle like they did."

When the football coaching position opened, Comerford jumped at the chance to come back to his alma mater.

"Timon has a place in my heart and I wanted to come back and help the program," he said.

Comerford served as the school's Director of Admissions for a year before being named to replace longtime Athletic Director Jim Palano, who was retiring.

"Jim is a friend of mine," Comerford said. "He really helped out and made the transition a smooth one. He's still helping me."

West Runs Over Frontier

West Seneca West made a statement when they ran over Frontier 28-12 in the season-opener last week.

"We knew coming in that Frontier had a great fullback and a great quarterback," West Seneca West coach Joe Cantafio said.

"They run the option offense very well. Their JV team went undefeated last year so we knew they had some good kids coming up."

The Indians dominated the game at the line of scrimmage. The Indians rolled up 337 yards rushing and passed just once through the entire game.

"We knew we had to be disciplined and physical," Cantafio said. "We had to win the battle on the line of scrimmage. We shut them down. We held them to under 100 yards on the ground and they are one of the best option teams around."

West Seneca West also had three different running backs rush for more than 100 yards in the win.

Devin Reynolds led the ground attack with 113 yards and 2 TDs on 12 carries before leaving the game with an ankle injury in the second quarter.

"Devin is a strong, tough, hard-nosed runner," Cantafio said. "He's a three-year starter and he works hard."

Chris Walker entered the game and ran for 121 yards and a TD on just 9 carries. Walker broke away for a 62-yard run to set up a TD. He scored his TD on an 11-yard run.

"Chris is smaller than Devon but he's very quick," Cantafio said. "He's a good athlete and has played varsity basketball since his freshman year."

Pete Walsh also got in on the act as he ran 20 times for 103 yards and a TD.

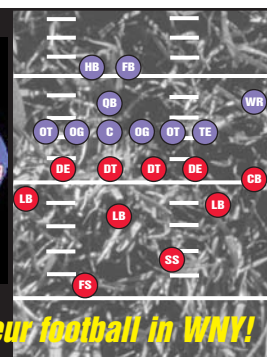
"I'm very proud of these guys," Cantafio said. "When you only throw one pass, the defense will have 10 men in the box and we still had three kids go over 100 yards. Our line and our FB Rory Wieler were outstanding, especially on a night that was so hot like that."

Last fall, the Indians gave notice that they were not going to be pushovers this season. After starting the season with six losses, West Seneca West won their last three games.

"This group of seniors is very special," Cantafio said. "This group of kids did everything you could have asked them. When they started 0-6, they didn't listen to the people in the stands. They never stopped believing in each other. No matter who we go up against these kids will put their best effort out there."

Cantafio was also pleased that the Indians earned a league win in the season's first week.

"If we are going to give ourselves some post-season opportunities, it's very important to get a league win," Cantafio said.

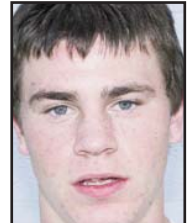

Justin Slango - Wilson

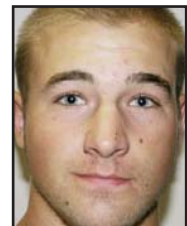

Panthers are Quick as Cats

East High opened the season with an impressive 36-6 win over Newfane last week.

"We have speed all over the field," East coach Starling Bryant said. "We have speed at quarterback, running back and wide receiver. I think they had a tough time keeping up with us, especially when we got to the outside."

Bryant said, that even though the Panthers offense was in high gear, his team needs work in a number of areas if they are going to contend for the Class B playoffs.

"I was disappointed with a number of missed tackles," he said. "We were arm tackling. We had missed assignments. We made a lot of mental mistakes."

His biggest concern was penalties.

"One of my guys blocked a defender 40 yards away from the play," Bryant said, "and we got a touchdown called back. That's just a lack of discipline. I was very pleased but we still have a lot of areas to work on."

Excitement is high among the Panthers for a playoff push in 2012.

"I know it's just the first week," Bryant said, "but this is the first time we have been in first place since we were in the old Harvard Cup League.

In 2010, our first year in Section 6, we only lost two games but we couldn't qualify for the playoffs."

Bryant says that before anyone starts talking playoffs, however, the Panthers need to clean up their own game.

"We need to be disciplined," he said. "Teams like Alden and Depew are very disciplined programs. We tend to get down if we get behind. Mentally, we need to be prepared and stay focused."

Then he added...

"But... they have to handle our speed."

Um... yeah. That speed.

Frankly, the speed on the East roster is enough to give any opposing defensive coordinator nightmares.

In the win over Newfane, Daquan Sylvester rushed for 169 yards on just 6 carries. Dajuan Charles ran 10 times for 127 yards. Julian Hodge caught 3 passes for 76 yards.

And, directing the fastest show in Western New York is QB Jevante Glover - who may be the fastest player on

the team.

"He's pretty fast," Bryant said. "We timed him at 4.48 in the 40 last year. He looks faster this year but we haven't timed him yet."

But Glover is so much more than just a speed demon. His size and strength make the senior QB a legitimate Division I-A college prospect.

"He's very strong," Bryant said. "His lower legs and thighs are very powerful. Normally, one guy will not bring him down. Jevante is a tough runner and he is our best defensive player, too."

In fact, Glover recorded 9 tackles and a QB sack in the win over Newfane.

"When he hits you, you are going nowhere," Bryant said. "He could play cornerback or linebacker or anywhere else in college. We have him at quarterback because we want him to have the ball on every single play."

Glover has a lot of colleges watching his senior season. However, he still has to get his transcripts in order before he can hope to accept a Division I-A scholarship.

"Jevante started school late when he was younger," Bryant said, "and he fell behind a bit. Right now, he is taking a loaded schedule. If he does everything he is supposed to, he will be able to graduate on time in June."

Bryant says that Glover is not a bad student.

"He's never failed a class," Bryant said. "He is never late for class. He's a well-mannered kid and very respectful. But, he could work a little harder in the classroom."

And while every player hopes for a Division I-A scholarship right out of high school, there are other options.

"There are a couple of Prep Schools in North Carolina that are very interested in him," Bryant said. "He may have to go that route. I know that there are a number of 2-year schools interested."

Bryant says that whoever gets Glover will be getting an incredibly dynamic player.

"Jevante has a very good demeanor," Bryant said. "He's a tough kid but he's very easy going. He always has a smile on his face. And he is a leader. He has a quiet confidence and the other kids follow his lead. And, yes, he is pretty fast."

"His attention to detail is very good," Bass said. "You can tell him something once and then he wants to go over it again. He wants to watch film and ask questions. He's always trying to get better and he's always trying to get the team better."

Davis (6-2, 230) was one of the Wolverines leading tacklers against

Corbi Leads Lancaster

Lancaster rallied from a 10-0 halftime deficit to beat Niagara Falls 16-10 in the season-opener last weekend.

The win was the first game for new coach Chris Dickson, who replaced long-time coach Len Jankiewicz who retired after the 2011 season.

"I was the JV coach for Len," Dickson said. "To be a head coach in high school has been a goal of mine. I never thought it would happen here but I'm very honored that it did."

The Redskins did not exactly start the way Dickson had hoped as they fell behind 10-0.

"We have a bunch of guys who have a lot of heart and will fight right to the end," he said. "We made mistakes early in the first half but the kids didn't let it bother them. We toughened up turned it around."

The Redskins finished the game with 173 passing yards. Dan Corbi had a big night as he caught 5 passes for 110 yards.

"He had an unbelievable night," Dickson said. "We were looking for him to step up and he did. He made some key 3rd down catches later in the game."

Corbi, a junior, played for Dickson on the JV level.

"He was a little raw but he was very talented," Dickson said. "We weren't sure where we wanted to put him. He played QB and WR last year. He's a very gifted athlete."

Dickson was moved almost exclusively to WR this season.

"Every now and then we'll play him at free safety," Dickson said. "He's not afraid to go across the middle for balls. He made a beautiful catch right before the half. No

one thought he would catch it."

Corbi also plays baseball and basketball at Lancaster and has an academic average around 90.

"Dan is a very good student," Dickson said. "He's very respectful and just goes about his business and works hard."

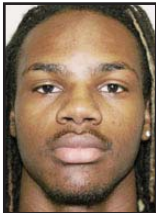

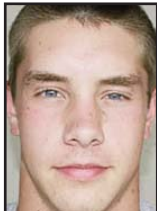

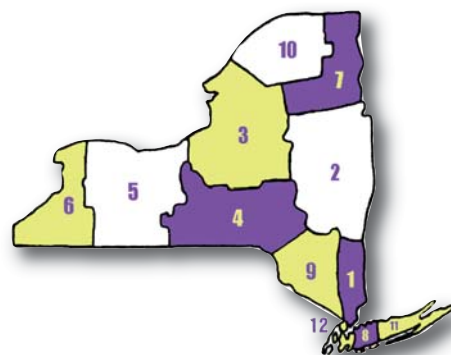

A Show of Haines

Raiders hoping all-state lineman Cortland Haines is back soon

Jamestown opened the season with a solid 27-8 win over Kenmore West in a AA crossover game.

"I thought it was a typical first game," coach Tom Langworthy said. "A lot of mistakes were made but I thought our kids played with a lot of heart and fought through some adversity."

The Red Raiders led just 7-0 lead at the half but, after falling behind, scored 3 TDs in the third quarter to pull away.

"We got three scores in about 6 minutes," Langworthy said. "That was a big stretch for us."

Da'Quan Hollingsworth opened the scoring with a 10-yard TD run in the first quarter. After Ken West scored to pull ahead 8-7, Jamestown struck in quick fashion.

Raiders' QB Jacob Sisson hit Steve Carlson with a 66-yard TD pass. Hollingsworth then returned a punt 66 yards for a TD. Hollingsworth then capped the frenzy with a 17-yard sprint into the end zone.

Langworthy, who led his team to Ralph Wilson Stadium in 2011, felt good that the Raiders escaped the first week with a win.

"I think both teams were very young on Friday and both teams got some experience," Langworthy said. "Ken West is a strong team and I expect them to do well up in the North Division. We still need to get our players used to how intense the varsity level is."

Langworthy said that while many expect the Raiders to challenge Orchard Park for the Section 6 title this season, he may need a few weeks to get everyone settled into their roles.

"We have a lot of young players in the lineup this year," Langworthy said. "On offense, we had just three players in positions that they had played before Friday night. On

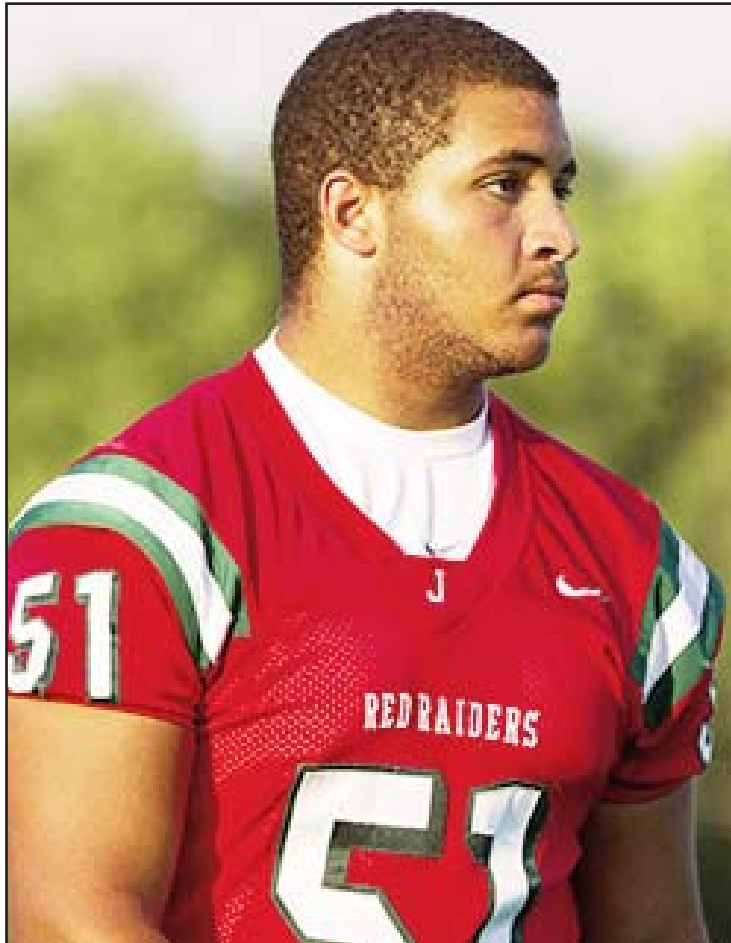

Haines, who has started on both the offensive and defensive lines, missed the opening game after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery. It was the first time in his career that Haines missed a game.

"He had a bone chip in the knee and had to get surgery to take care of it," Langworthy said. "He had the surgery a week ago and they took 3 chips out. He is strengthening his knee and having therapy so he can get back on the field when he is ready."

The timetable for Haines' return to the lineup is unclear right now.

"We don't know how many games he is going to miss," Langworthy said. "We think he'll be back this week or for

defense, we had just 4 kids back."

One player that helped immediately was Sisson, who transferred into Jamestown over the summer from Bettonville High School in Arkansas.

"His family is originally from Jamestown," Langworthy said. "His father got a job in Arkansas and they moved away when he was in the 8th grade."

This past year, Sisson's family was able to move back to the Southern Tier of WNY.

"His father got another job opportunity and they moved back home," Langworthy said. "He already knew all of the guys on the team. He went to elementary school with most of them. It wasn't a total culture shock for him."

Sisson completed 7 of 12 passes for 145 yards and a TD.

But, the Raiders may get the most help when three-year starter Cortland Haines returns to the lineup.

Week 3. We have to make sure he is ready to safely play. We'll start him with some work on the offense."

Haines, a 6-2, 250-pound senior, was named a first-team WNY all-star last season. He was also named a 3rd-team all-state player as a defensive lineman. He has started on both the lines since his sophomore year.

"He was a dominant player on the JV level as a 9th grader," Langworthy said. "He was big, strong and had a great attitude."

The decision to bring Haines up to the varsity for his sophomore season was easy, according to Langworthy.

"We new he was talented," he said, "and we knew he was a hard worker. He started coming down to our weight room in the eighth grade and he never missed a day in there."

With Haines in the lineup, the Red Raiders began to rebuild their once dominant program. Jamestown, with two NYS championships in the 1990s, had struggled with mediocrity for most of the 2000s. In 2010, the Raiders made the playoffs and beat Riverside 7-6 in the first round.

"That was a huge win for our program," Langworthy said. "That was our first playoff win in 10 years."

In 2011, the Raiders finished 8-2 - with both losses coming to eventual New York State champion Orchard Park. And while most people in the Southern Tier community have their eye on a return trip to The Ralph, Langworthy insists that no Raider is even thinking about winning a Section 6 title.

"Our goal is to get better every day and make sure our team is better every week," he said. "Between Weeks 1 and 2, there should be some major improvement. If we continue to get better, we'll be a tough team that will be in the mix for the playoffs."

Certainly, any improvement would be easier if Haines can return to the lineup this week.

"Cortland's strength and his knowledge of the game is exceptional," Langworthy said. "His technique is superb. He has a lot of intensity and plays with a lot of controlled rage. He really wants to go out there and push people around."

Haines has an academic average in the upper 80s.

"He's a good kid," Langworthy said. "He's very respectful and he's a good teammate. The kids respect him and what he has to say."

There are a few division I schools that are inquiring about Haines, though no hard-core recruiting has occurred yet.

"We've heard from UB, Syracuse and Mercyhurst," Langworthy said. "There are a number of Division II and Division III schools interested in him as well. I'm glad he has an opportunity to play after high school. He's worked hard and he deserves the opportunity."

Haines says that he didn't dwell on the fact that he missed a game for the first time in his career.

"It didn't bother me because I know I will be back playing pretty soon," he said. "I was just hoping we would pull through and win and we did. I was just trying to help my teammates and give them moral and vocal support."

Haines says he is not hoping to get another chance at a Section 6 title... not yet anyway.

"I'm just looking for our team to go out game by game," he said. "Just go out and hit somebody. If we play physically, the wins and losses will take care of themselves."

Joe Scibilia Leading Brockport

Brockport State is hoping for a rebound from last year's disappointing 3-7 record. An 0-5 start wrecked a season which started with high hopes for the Golden Eagles.

"We had some very close games that we lost at the start," Brockport coach Rocco Salomone said. "We regrouped after that and we finished 3-2. We beat Kean when they were ranked number-7 in the nation."

Salomone said that, while the early losses were difficult, he never lost faith in his players.

"We had a pretty young roster," he said. "They had played well. They just didn't know how to finish a game. We kept telling them that we could do this. They had to learn how to finish a game and eventually they did."

The 28-20 win over Kean was a statement.

"It was a solid win," Salomone said. "We played really well and it was never really in doubt. That was definitely a turning point."

The Golden Eagles youth has now turned into experienced players for the 2012 season.

"We have 10 starters back on offense and a lot of them are still underclassmen,"

Salomone said. "Offense has been our strength the last couple of years."

Brockport lost games by scores such as 51-30 and 64-43 in 2011.

"Our offense has really been pretty good," Salomone said. "We average almost 35 points a game. Defensively, we struggled and we addressed that with our recruiting this off-season."

The new emphasis on improving the defense seems to have worked. The Eagles beat Lycoming 24-2 in the season-opener last weekend.

Leading the offense is Starpoint graduate QB Joe Scibilia, who is beginning his third season as Brockport's starting QB.

"Joe is a very good athlete," Salomone said. "He has a very strong arm, an extremely strong arm. He has really

taken to coaching and he works very hard."

Scibilia was named the New Jersey Conference Offensive Player of the Week after the win over Lycoming.

Scibilia completed 21 of 34 passes for 324 yards, the second-most total in his four-year career. Scibilia threw for 353 yards on 39 completions against Montclair State in 2011.

The 324 yards are also the 10th most for a single game in Brockport history. Scibilia is now just 86 yards shy of 4,000 career yards.

"The physical tools are all there with Joe," Salomone said. "You really saw his production was there right away. He's also a very smart young man and a very good student."

The only criticism of Scibilia is that he was quiet... too quiet for a quarterback.

"We really needed him to take a more active leadership role," Salomone said. "He's a very quiet guy. But this past off-season you saw his leadership really come out. He's always been a great kid as an example but we wanted him to start speaking up and he has done that."

Scibilia will now lead the Golden Eagles into their annual I-90 Rivalry game

against Buffalo State this weekend.

Strangely, for the first time in many years, the I-90 Bowl will have no bearing on either team's conference records.

"We were in the N-Jac together for years," Salomone said. "But Buff State joined the Empire 8 for this season. We won't be joining the Empire 8 until 2014 so this game is a non-conference game this year."

Salomone says that the Eagles won't need a conference game to get up to face the Benhags.

"It has no bearing on our conference record," Salomone said. "But, for our kids and their kids, it's still a big game. All of these kids played with each other and against each other in high school. Most of the kids in the game are from Buffalo and Rochester. Even though it's not a conference game, it's still important to the kids."

Bossman stars for Cortland

After opening the season with a 49-31 loss at Buffalo State, Cortland had two weeks to prepare for their conference opener against Western Connecticut State.

If Cortland is going to rebound, they will need to rely on senior Phil Bloom - an East Aurora graduate who is now a 4-year starter for the Red Dragons.

"Phil came right in and took over at safety as a freshman," Cortland coach Dan MacNeill said. "He is a legitimate, 4-year starter. That doesn't happen very often at the college level."

MacNeill said that Bossman may have actually been the easiest recruiting job he ever had.

"He in to my office in the summertime before his senior year at East Aurora," MacNeill said. "He came in

with his tape. We put the tape on and it was an easy one. He would definitely be a top-recruit for us."

There were other schools looking at Bossman, however.

"We knew he would be a special talent," MacNeill said. "Colgate and Lehigh were looking at him, too. We encouraged him to come to a Cortland game."

Bossman came back to Cortland to see the Dragons host Montclair State.

"We beat Montclair," MacNeill said. "He got home after the game, called me and committed to Cortland."

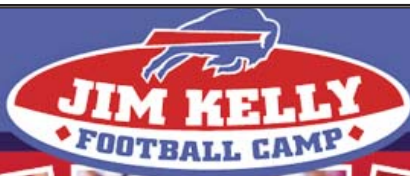
