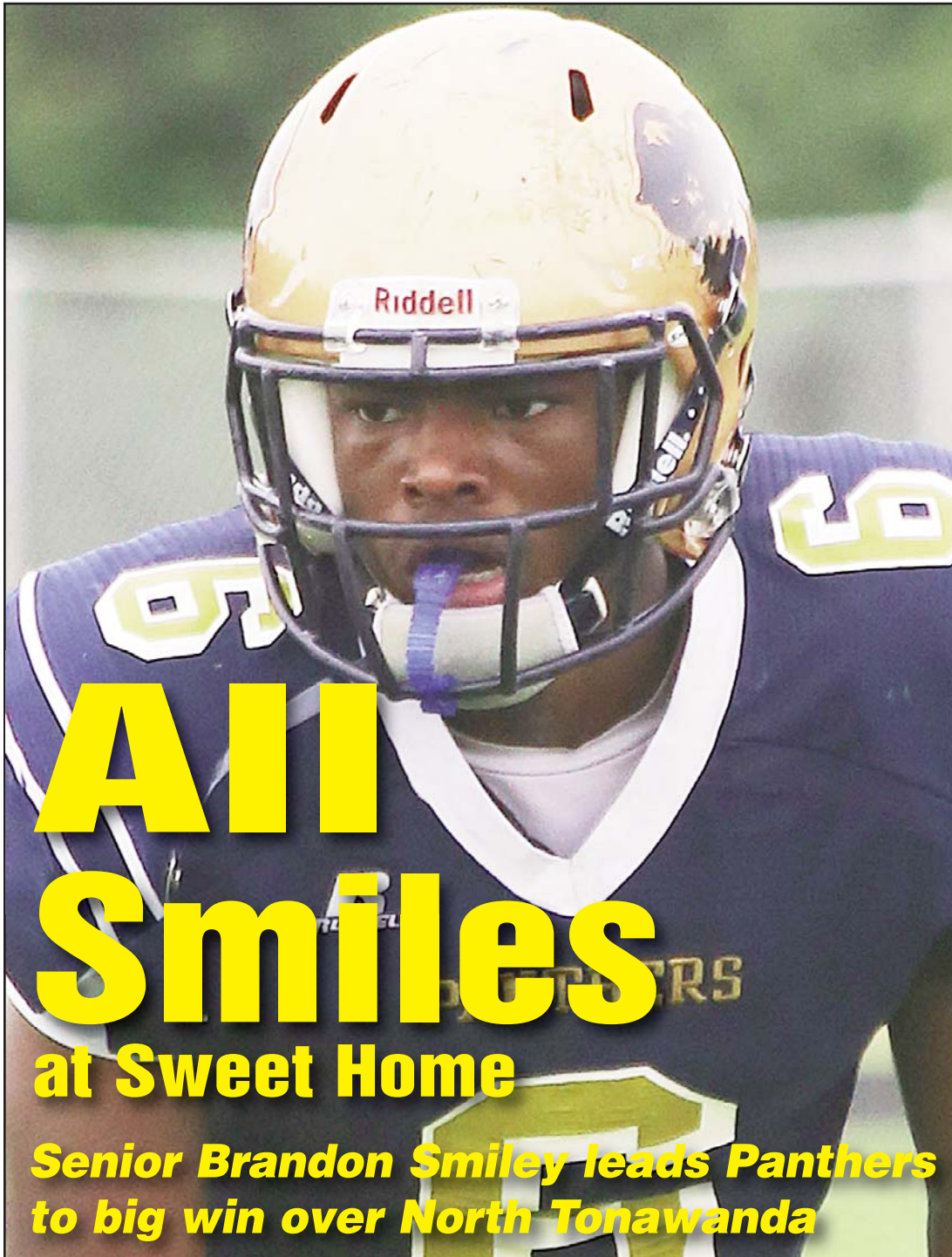

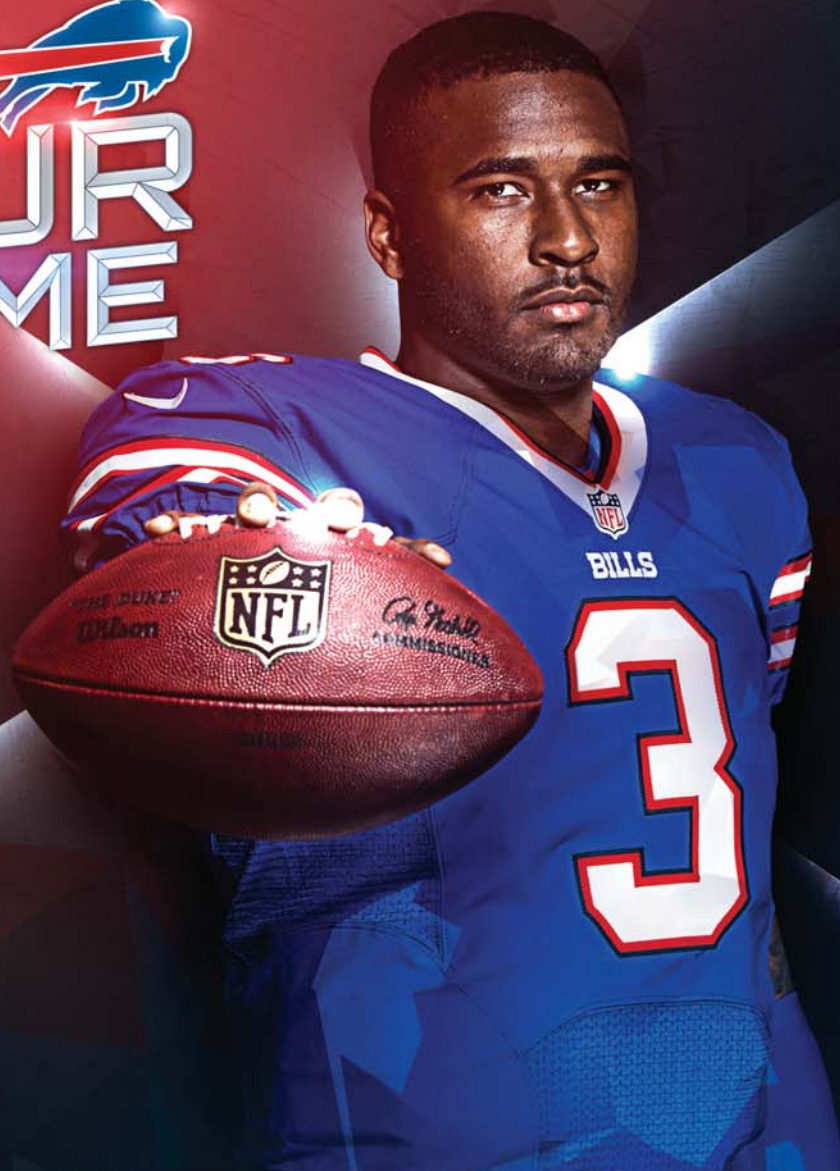

Sirianni Honored for Trojans Win

Southwestern coach Jay Sirianni was named the Buffalo Bills/National Guard Coach of the Week after his Trojans beat Cleve Hill 37-18 last weekend.

Interestingly, Sirianni received word that the Bills had honored him as he was driving home from the team's game against the San Diego Chargers last week... the same team that Sirianni's brother is the quarterbacks coach for.

"I think if the Bills had known that, they probably would have taken the award away," Sirianni joked. "The Chargers beat the Bills, I got to watch my little brother coach in the game, I got to talk with Frank Reich and I was notified of this on the way home. That's not too bad of a day."

Southwestern got off to a quick start in the win over Cleve Hill when Hunter Peterson returned the kickoff 85 yards for a TD.

"Starting a game that way gets everyone going," Sirianni said. "He outran everyone. He wasn't even touched."

Cleve Hill was stopped on their ensuing drive and punted to the Southwestern 5-yard line.

The Trojans responded with a 95-yard scoring drive to take a 14-0 lead.

"That was great watching our kids being able to do that," Sirianni said. "To drive 95 yards like that on a good program is pretty good football. The kids did everything right on that drive."

Later in the first quarter, Cleve Hill trailed 14-6 and had the ball deep in their own territory.

Southwestern's Cory Breyton intercepted a pass and returned it 14 yards for a TD and a 21-6 lead.

"In first quarter we had an offensive TD, a defensive TD and a special teams TD," Sirianni said. "I can't remember having that happen in a game much less in

the first quarter."

Sirianni says that the outburst was a welcome change from recent history.

"It was nice to get the jump on Cleve Hill and get out in front early," he said. "All last year we played from behind. We got outscored 86-6 in the first quarter. We fell behind in the first two games this year. If I could explain it, it wouldn't be happening."

While he was pleased, Sirianni was surprised to that it was Cleve Hill that the Trojans jumped on.

"Glen Graham is one of the better coaches around,"

he said, "and we try to schedule tough non-league games because the competition makes you better. That's why we want to play teams like Cleveland Hill."

Southwestern is now 3-0 on the season.

"Obviously, we are feeling pretty good at 3-0," Sirianni said. "We are where we want to be but we have a lot of the season left to go. We're still fighting for playoff positioning. There is still a lot of football left to play."

In addition to game's against Salamanca, MGCLake and Pioneer, the Trojans will have their annual rivalry game with Falconer... sort of.

"It's still Falconer," Sirianni said, "but since they merged with Cassadaga Valley it will be a little weird playing them with Blue & Red Uniforms. The game is at Falconer so it's not the same but, then again, it will still be a big game. We can approach that in Week 7."

Sirianni played high school football at Southwestern before playing at Mount Union in Ohio, where he was a backup QB.

He served as an assistant coach at Maple Grove under Curt Fischer and won a state title in 1998. He also coached the WRs at Alfred University for 2 years and took over at Southwestern in 2003.

Steve Foley Solid on Nichols O-Line

Nichols traveled north of the border into Canada last weekend and came back with an old-school result... the Big green played to a 15-15 tie against Villanova in Ontario.

"I have coached 200 varsity games and have never been a tie," Nichols coach Colin Brinson said. "It was a non-league game for them and they do not play overtime in non-league games. So, it was a good game and, I guess in the spirit of Good International Relations, we decided to call it a tie."

was a nightmare for a coach. We had to put an extra guy in because it's 12-man football up there. It's a very wide field. It's 65 yards wide while it's only 53 yards in the US. Defensively we had to account for that, offensively we had to put an extra man in for that. It was a challenge."

One player that has been a stand out for the Big Green is senior center Steve Foley. Foley, who also starts on the DL, had 8 tackles, 2 for loss, and blocked a punt in the tie.

"That set us up for a touchdown," Brinson said. "It was a big play at that moment in the game."

Foley (6-4, 215) is tied for the team-lead in tackles and also serves as the Nichols long snapper.

"He has great hands," Brinson said. "He played QB on the modified level because he has a good arm. He's a good long-snapper and we do a lot of shot gun."

Foley also plays basketball and tennis and is one of the top students at Nichols.

"He has an amazing work ethic," Brinson said. "He is a serious, serious student, he plays three sports and is a team captain for us. He's everything you could want in a high school football player."

Nichols led 15-14 with :25 left as Villanova lined up to try and game-winning field goal.

The kick was wide, however, the ball did not go out of the end zone, which are 25 yards deep in Canada.

"We fielded it but we didn't get it out of the end zone," Brinson said. "You must field all kicks and punts and run them out or it's a 1-point Rouge."

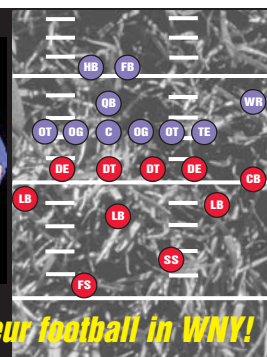
So, the game ended at 15-15.

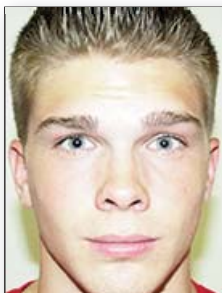

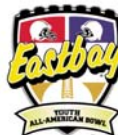

Jamestown Readies for Canisius

Jamestown will host Canisius this weekend in one of the most highly anticipated games in WNY history. The Red Raiders are the defending Section 6 Class AA champions while Canisius comes in as the 49th-ranked team in the entire nation.

"We are expecting a big crowd," Jamestown coach Tom Langworthy said. "It will probably be the biggest crowd in the history of Strider Field. We had pre-sale tickets and they were selling quick."

Langworthy said that this game is all he has heard people talk about wherever he goes throughout the small city.

"No doubt, people are excited," he said. "It's an anticipated matchup and it's exciting to be a part of it. It's one of those games you schedule and all of a sudden it's finally here. This is a great opportunity

Jamestown enters the game 3-0 after wins over Sweet Home, West Seneca West and Lancaster. The Raiders only losses in the past two seasons came either at Ralph Wilson Stadium (2012) or against Aquinas in the New York State tournament.

Canisius brings a resume that's even more gaudy.

The Crusaders destroyed Rochester's McQuaid and then crushed defending state-champ Aquinas 34-0. The Little Irish had entered the game ranked 48th in the nation... the exact spot that Canisius now holds in the *USAToday* high school football rankings.

Canisius followed that up by traveling to Ohio and playing the Cleveland-area's 2nd-ranked team, Walsh Jesuit. The Crusaders led 40-7 at the half and cruised the rest of the way in a 43-7 win.

Playing a program this good is not quite what Langworthy had in mind when he scheduled Canisius last year.

"I didn't think about any national rankings when we scheduled them," he said. "They are a good team with great athletes and they well coached. We played Sweet Home in a non-league game for the same reason."

Langworthy scheduled Canisius with one thought in mind... preparing his team for the post-season.

"This is the middle of the regular season," he said. "It's the perfect time to take on a great team and see where we stack up. They are a heck of a program and playing them will only make us better down the road."

And, Langworthy says, his small city is crackling with excitement.

"It's exciting for us to play a team like this," he said. "The students are really excited and everyone in town is fired up to be there. I am sure that the Rowdy Raiders will be in full attendance in the student section. This is a game that no one wants to miss. This is an awesome opportunity to have this caliber of football right here in Jamestown."

In last week's win over Lancaster, the Raiders led 14-7 at the half. They scored 3 TDs in the third quarter to pull away.

"Our running game was really good against Lancaster," Langworthy said. "Zacc Kinsey had over 200 yards rushing. We rushed for over 300 as a team. We had over 600 yards of total offense."

Nicc Holland completed 15 of 21 passes for 206 yards and 3 TDs.

"Nicc is doing a great job," Langworthy said. "He is making good decisions and getting better each week. He is getting more confident each game."

But, if the Raiders want to beat the nation's 48th-ranked team, they will need a big game from senior linebacker Damien Jackson.

"With our team, some of our skill players get a lot more attention," Langworthy said. "That's just the nature of things. Statistics are what gets the attention.

Jackson, however, is a crucial piece of the Red Raiders squad.

"Damien is the glue of our defense," Langworthy said. "He holds things together. He's a

team captain and a big senior leader."

Jackson (6-0, 205) is a 2-year starter at LB and also starts at right tackle while playing on all special teams

"A lot of our guys played against Aquinas in the state regional game last year," Langworthy said. "We have a great senior group of players that are the core of the team. Damien is the vocal leader of that group. He lets the team know what we need to improve."

Jackson is an Honor Roll student with an academic average in the mid-90s.

"He's extremely smart," Langworthy said. "He's able to diagnose other teams offensive formations and tendencies. He helps us get into the right defense for the right situation."

Langworthy has known Jackson since he was young.

"I've known him since he was in youth football,"

Langworthy said. "He caught our attention when he was in 9th grade. We knew he would be a good football player back then."

Zac Kelly Makes Big Plays

Williamsville North scored once in each quarter and beat Niagara Falls 28-12 last week to improve 3-0.

"Niagara Falls is a very good team," coach Mike Mammoliti said. "The wind really dictated a lot of the game for both teams. The kicking games and passing games were really difficult."

Despite the wind, QB Chad Steinwachs completed 10 of 17 passes for 99 yards.

"We thought we were going to be able to throw the ball a little more," Mammoliti said. "He was 4-for-4 on PAT kicks and he didn't do too bad punting, either."

North is 3-0 on the season, 1-0 in AA North games.

"I like where we are," Mammoliti said. "I like the fact that we have a lot of guys contributing. We have 3 sophomores who are starting for us. I like the fact that we have been balanced in the run and the pass. Our special teams has played well. We've blocked a punt in each of our games."

If Williamsville North is going to win the AA North title this season, they will need to keep getting big contributions from WR Zac Kelly, who also starts at FS. "Zac doesn't come off the field,"

Mammoliti said. "He also plays on the punt team, the kickoff team, the return teams and the hands team. He's on everything."

Kelly (6-0, 170) is 3-year starter.

"His football IQ is really high," Mammoliti said. "He's a smart kid. He knows what to do and he doesn't get rattled."

Kelly is also making a habit of making huge plays at crucial moments. Last fall, he caught the game-tying TD pass in the waning moments of the

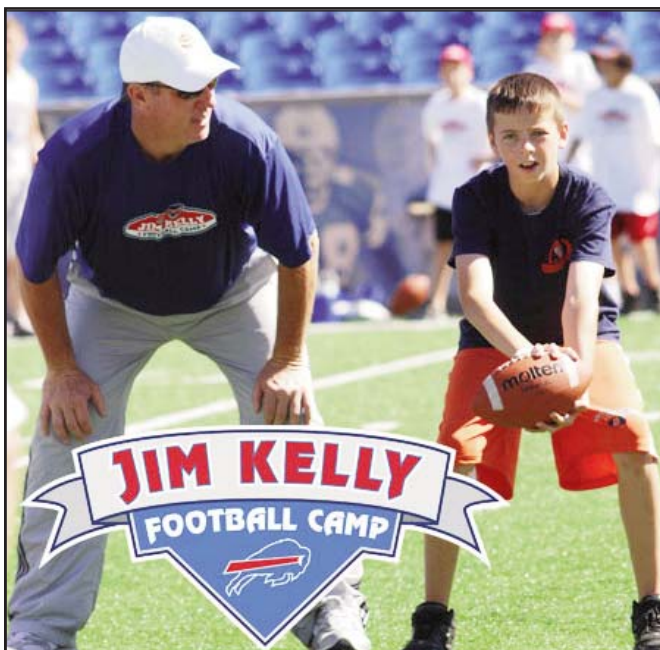

Brinkel Leads Frontier

Frontier trailed the entire game but scored a pair of TDs in the fourth quarter to pull out a 39-27 win over Clarence.

"Our kids really responded well to adversity," Frontier coach Mark Privateer said. "We didn't play very well in the early going. We even gave up a blocked punt for a TD. But the kids fought back."

The Falcons trailed 21-6 in the second quarter.

"No one thought the game was over," Privateer said. "They knew that if we stopped making mistakes we could get back into it."

The Falcons had pulled to within 21-19 at halftime but the still trailed 27-25 after three quarters.

"Entering 4th quarter, our kids had confidence in each other and the coaches," Privateer said. "We just wanted to keep the momentum going our way."

Frontier took the lead when QB Zach Kmitch hit Paul Brinkel with a 79-yard TD pass. Brinkel finished the night with

78 rushing yards and a TD on just 3 carries. He also caught 2 passes for 93 yards and another 2 TDs. On defense, Brinkel intercepted a pass at the 1-yard line to stop a Clarence drive.

"He is such a great athlete," Privateer said. "and he has breakaway speed. We need to get him the ball in space and let him outrun the field."

Brinkel (6-1, 185) also starts for the Frontier baseball team. He was voted as a team captain this season.

"He's a quiet leader," Privateer said. "He leads by example. The work he puts in the off-season and his zest for the game really inspires the other guys."

Starpoint led 19-0 at the half and beat Williamsville East 32-6 last week.

"Williamsville East is huge on the offensive line," coach Al Cavnagaro said. "We knew it would be tough running

inside. We had to use our quickness to get outside."

Terry Rutland led the offense as he rushed for 182 yards and 3 TDs.

The Spartans stayed in the hunt for the Class A playoffs with the win.

"We think we're a playoff team," Cavnagaro said. "We are confident and we have a lot of different weapons this year."

Cavnagaro says that the Spartans are using an offense that is much more diverse than in past seasons.

"We have four running backs," he said. "Our quarterback has been playing great and we have guys who can catch the ball. We feel pretty good right now."

If the Spartans are going to make the playoffs, they will rely on LB Austin Bratek.

"Austin had a great defensive game," Cavnagaro said. "He plays LB but he's like the QB on our defense. He makes sure that everybody is in the right spot."

Bratek (5-11, 180) is a 3-year starter.

"He started at defensive back as a sophomore," Cavnagaro said, "but as he got bigger he moved into the LB spot."

Bratek has an academic average in the high 90s.

"He's a smart football player, too," Cavnagaro said. "He watches film and knows the tendencies of the other team. He can look at a formation and know what they are going to do. He relays that to the other guys. He gets to the right spot before the ball does."

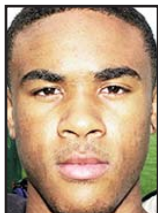

"We moved him up to the varsity halfway through his sophomore year," Nagel said. "He was faster than anyone we had at the time. We played him at OLB and he could make plays."

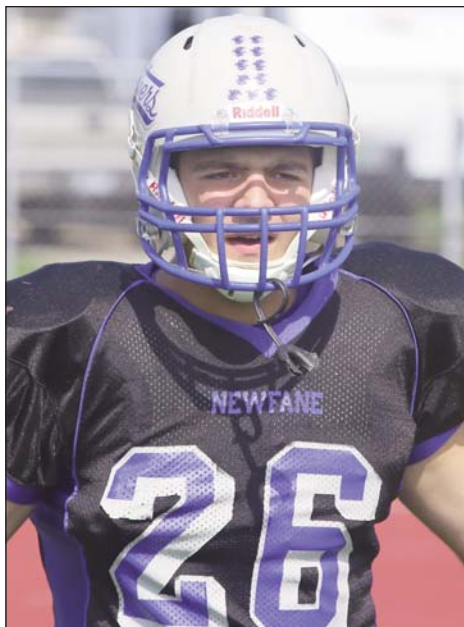

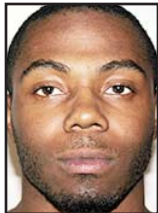

"We had some big holes on the line and we needed him back there," Buccieri said. "He has played at a high level all season."

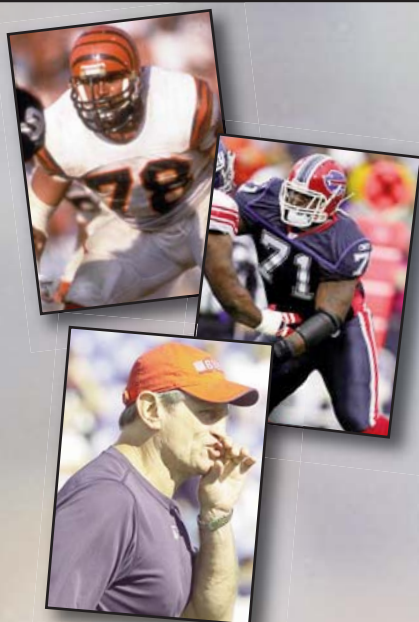

Panthers' Brandon Smiley stars in big win over NT

Sweet Home beat North Tonawanda 39-15 last weekend in the first big league test of the season.

The Panthers are now 2-0 in the league and tied for first place.

"Right now, we are about 85 percent of where we should be," Sweet Home coach John Faller said. "We are still feeling out a couple of positions like everyone else. We have some kids nicked up and we will be trying to fill those spots until they can come back."

Faller says that he was worried about defending the Lumberjacks Triple Option offense.

"We knew we were going against a Triple Option team," he said, "and that is assignment football. We knew that the QB would be getting the most of their carries and we needed to focus on our assignments."

Faller says his players worked all week on staying in position and leaping their assignments.

"The worked hard all week," he said, "but it's one thing to do it against the prep team in practice and another to do it against the other team in a game."

North Tonawanda scored first to take a 7-0 lead but Jordan Evert returned the kickoff 85 yards for a TD to pull Sweet Home within 7-6.

The Panthers took the lead for good in the second quarter when Kevin Torrillo hit Justice Milton with a 30-yard TD pass.

"Justice made a nice play," Faller said. "He jumped up and got it. He's done a nice job this season."

Sweet Home led 12-7 at the half but took control in the third quarter with three TDs.

"Our defense bent a little bit but we didn't break," Faller said.

"We were able to make some big plays. We have some guys who can break it open at any time this year."

One of those players is senior Brandon Smiley.

"Brandon started with us as a sophomore," Faller said. "He was All-WNY as a junior last year."

Smiley starts at WR and LB for the Panthers but plays a big role on virtually every team the Panthers have.

"He's a pretty good LB on defense," Faller said, "but we can use him where ever we want. He intercepts passes, returns kicks. We even used him in the running game against NT."

Smiley caught 3 passes for 63 yards and a TD in the win over North Tonawanda. He also rushed for 97 yards and a TD on 7 carries.

"We saw him when he

was a freshman playing for the JV team," Faller said.

"You could tell he had a lot of potential and that he could do all the basic things. He was only about 5-11 then but we moved him up to varsity and each year he grew a bit and got stronger."

Smiley is now 6-foot-2, 195 pounds and runs a 4.5 in the 40-yard dash. He also has an academic average in the mid-90s and is one of the top players in Western New York.

"He's a Division I caliber kid," Faller said, "and there aren't a lot of them in Buffalo. He has everything going for him."

Smiley has already been offered - and accepted - a

scholarship to play football at the University at Buffalo in 2015.

"He's a good athlete, with a good attitude and good grades," Faller said. "That's why UB is giving him a scholarship. They know he can help them. They got a good catch with Brandon."

Faller says, amazingly, that Smiley can get even better than he is now.

"He'll improve this year and improve even more when he gets to UB," he said. "He has to keep working hard. He'll get bigger and stronger and he'll get some individual coaching in college. He's a great athlete so they'll fit him in where they want him on the field."

Smiley also takes his responsibilities as a team captain seriously, according to Faller.

"He's a quiet kid," Faller said, "but he helps out the other kids and talks to them. All my captains have their little groups that they talk to and they bring the team together as one. Brandon has done a good job with that."

Smiley scored on a 64-yard pass and a 23-yard run in the win over North Tonawanda but doesn't feel the Panthers played particularly well.

"We came out kind of flat," Smiley said. "I feel like the line wasn't clicking and that's where everything starts. But good teams always find a way to win and once the line started clicking, our offense started to go. Our defense picked it up from there."

Smiley says that he feels that this year's Panthers are better than the team that finished 9-1 and lost the Class A title game to Williamsville North.

"Everyone is close this year," he said. "Everybody all lives close to each other or we see each other on the weekends outside of football."

He says that he does not even think about losing to Williamsville North at Ralph Wilson Stadium last fall.

"You have to have a short memory for football," he said. "You can't change the past and there is no purpose in dwelling on that. If you dwell on that game, you'll mess up the games in the future."

He didn't have to think very hard about committing to play at UB next fall either.

"I love the school," Smiley said. "UB is one of the top educational schools in the country. I get to play in front of my home crowd, basically right down the street from my house. I'll be away from home but, I'm still just down the street so I'll feel comfortable being there."

Smiley says he also wanted to play with UB running back Jordan Johnson - another Sweet Home grad.

"We grew up in the same neighborhood," Smiley said. "I was a freshman and he was a senior. He had a big fan base in the neighborhood. Everybody went to watch Jordan play."

The Panthers have now won twice after opening the season with a tough loss to Jamestown.

"We are trying to get better each week," Faller said. "These kids want to win the next four games in a row, get back to the playoffs and see what we can do."

Doherty is Big Time at Buff State

After opening the season with a pair of wins Buffalo State lost to Alfred 29-21 last weekend. The bengals trailed 29-7 in the second half but their rally fell short.

"We made too many mistakes," coach Jerry Boyes said. "We had some real opportunities to win the game but we made too many mistakes."

Boyes says that he is comfortable with where his program is at this point in time.

"I've seen a culture change here the last couple of seasons," Boyes said. "We've had growth. Just from the commitment level and working together. If you see the team keeping together, that's the first step in building a program."

Boyes has actually had to build the Buffalo State program twice.

He was hired to coach the Bengals in 1986 as Buffalo State was first entering the NCAA. He took the Bengals to a level of national prominence, leading them to the NCAA playoffs seven times in the 1990s.

"Building a team is an easy formula but is really tough to do," he said. "When you first take over and change the culture there will be adversity. You have to weather that initial storm. When the team handles that adversity and stays together, you know you are on the right track."

After Boyes stopped coaching to become the Buffalo State Athletic Director, the program fell on hard times. Boyes returned to the sideline six seasons ago to try and rebuild the program... again.

"Right now, there are so many similarities to where we were in 1986," he said. "We're pretty good now. What we haven't done is made some noise in league play. We've just been OK in the Empire 8. We haven't reached that higher level in our conference yet and that's the measuring stick now. We have the talent that puts us on a level playing field with our competitors in the Empire 8. Now it's the little things that win football games."

If the Bengals are going to make a statement in the tough Empire 8 Conference this season, they will need

more big games from wide receiver Mike Doherty.

"Mike has been one of our big impact players," Boyes said. "He's one of those big-time players that seems to make a big play when you really need it."

Doherty caught 59 passes for 1,029 yards and 6 TDs

in 2013. He has caught 19 passes for 399 yards and 4 TDs through this season's first 3 games.

"He's a solid blocker as a receiver," Boyes said. "He is also a punt and kickoff returner so he has an awful lot to do with our game."

Boyes knew Doherty in 2009, when he was still a freshman at Kenmore East.

"My son was a senior at Kenmore East and Mike was a freshman," he said. "I watched him in some JV basketball games and I followed him a little in the newspapers."

Doherty was overlooked in the recruiting process because he was a great player on a bad team at that time.

"I tried to recruit him but he thought that maybe he would get some scholarship nods,"

Boyes said. "He was certainly good enough. People talked to him but, for whatever reason, it just never happened. He went to ECC but transferred here after one year."

As a result, Buffalo State ended up with a solid player at wide receiver.

"He has all the skills," Boyes said. "He has fantastic hands. He can really make some catches that are unbelievable. He's been a big part of our success."

Doherty has also shown to be tenacious in overcoming adversity in his time at Buffalo State.

"He has injured both knees which took him out of two seasons," Boyes said. "He came back strong from both those injuries. He's tough and he's resilient."




Doherty is a team leader but is not a dominant personality, according to Boyes.

"You wouldn't know Mike was in the room," Boyes said. "He doesn't bring attention to himself. He won't tell you how good he is but he will show you."

St. John Fisher beat Brockport 36-20 in the annual Courage Bowl last week.

"There was over 9,000 people at the game this year," Fisher coach Paul Vosburgh said. "All the proceeds from the game go to Camp Good Days and Special Times. We've been running this for 10 years and it's a big deal now."

SJF took an early lead when Lockport grad James Chambers bolted for a 24-yard TD.

Later in the first quarter, Chambers scored a TD on a 59-yard pass play.

"He came to us after a year at UB," Vosburgh said. "He was a preferred walk-on at UB. We knew he was a great player coming out of high school."

Fisher led 23-0 at the half and had rushed for more than 200 yards. They finished the game with more than 400 yards rushing.

Chambers finished the day with 12 carries for 126 yards. He also had 81 yards in kickoff returns.

The Cardinals are now 2-0, 1-0 in Empire 8 games.

"The Empire 8 is a very strong league," Vosburgh said. "We have 7 more conference games to play and we better be ready for all 7."

Chambers was named the ECAC Rookie of the Week for his performance.

"He's a quiet kid," Vosburgh said. "He doesn't say a lot but he's new in the program and still feeling his way around. People watch him play and just know that he is very good," Vosburgh said.

Going Back to go Forward



Alden lost to St. Francis 42-21 last week a result that really surprised nobody.

Alden, a smaller school in Class B simply did not have the horses to keep up with one of the larger Catholic teams in Western New York.

The Bulldogs were outgunned from the beginning.

"I'm most proud of my kids because they competed,"

Alden coach Rob Currin said. "It was 21-14 with a minute left in the first half. They scored late but we came out for the third quarter down 28-14 and we had the ball. It was a good game."

The question is, why would Currin even considering playing such a large Catholic team?

"We've been in the position the last 5 years to represent Class B in the Section 6 Championship game," Currin said. "We've been ranked pretty high in the state rankings. If we're going to carry this title around, let's try and play some of the best teams there are."

By playing St. Francis, Currin is actually making a statement to his own players.

"Our kids believed that they could win the ball game if the continued to play hard," he said. "No matter who we play the expectation is that we will do our best and win the game."

But, Currin has another reason to play St. Francis... he also has a little history to go on.

Currin played for St. Francis, graduating in 1998. In fact, Currin is the very first former player to coach against St. Francis coach Jerry Smith, a veteran of 30 years.

"I played on that field," Currin said. "My senior year we had a 3-way tie for the league title with Canisius and St. Joe's. I was born in 1980 and Jerry was already coaching there. I helped him paint that field before games."

So, Currin was just feeling nostalgic? That's why he scheduled a game against St. Francis?

Actually, no. He had a far bigger reason in mind.

"During the 1997 season was the first year we played St. Ignatius in Cleveland, Ohio," Currin said. "When we

played them, they were ranked 4th in the nation and beat us 56-0. Everyone asked why the heck we would play a team like that."

But, Currin said, Jerry Smith knew why.

"A few years later, St. Francis actually scored on St. Ignatius," Currin said. "and a few years after that St. Francis actually beat them."

The competition from the bigger, badder team, had made St. Francis better in the long run.

Jerry was just starting to get into the national scene when I played against St. Ignatius," Currin said. "Staying in hotel rooms and traveling and playing the big-time programs really made St. Francis the first school in Western New York to reach that level."

So, on a smaller scale, Currin knew this will do the same for the Alden Bulldogs.

"That experience we had in Cleveland against St. Ignatius made us faster and better," Currin said. "I knew this would work for Alden, too."

Smith would actually hire Currin to coach his wide receivers on the freshman team. Currin had graduated from high school a few months before and the experience helped him to discover that he wanted to coach football.

"I went on to play at Buff State," Currin said. "I changed my major from Elementary Ed to Secondary Ed so I could get into the high schools and coach football. Coach Smith took me seriously and it helped set my path in life."

Smith, the longtime veteran who coached a teenage Currin in 1998, has a coaching tree that includes coaches at the high

school level, the college level and even the NFL. The General Managers of the Jacksonville Jaguars and the San Diego Chargers are former players of his.

And even with all that, Currin is still the first player of Smith to coach against him in a game.

"That's a nice honor to be able to have that in his history," Currin said. "I'm glad it worked out that way but I would have felt better if we had won."

For his part, Smith says he didn't think much about coaching against a former player... until the two head coaches met at midfield before the game started.

"I got a little emotional," Smith said. "I was more emotional than he was. I really felt extremely proud of him. He's such a nice guy and I know he is going to make an outstanding coach."
