



Iroquois Coach Honored for Upset Win

Iroquois coach Keith Marshall was named the Buffalo Bills / ADPRO Sports Coach of the Week after his team upset previously undefeated Starpoint 21-0 last week.

"We were a big underdog going into the game," Marshall said, "The kids made the plays, All the credit really goes to them. I was tremendously proud of them."

The Chiefs scored just one offensive TD in the game.

"A tremendous amount of credit has to go to our

defensive coordinator, Dave Bonacquisti," Marshall said, "and our special teams coach Rob Pitzonka, too, It was a defensive battle and those units won the game for us."

Starpoint had entered the game 7-0 and was a second seed. Iroquois was a third seed and had entered the game with a 4-3 record. The Chiefs did not qualify for the playoffs until the final day of the season.

"It was a huge upset," Marshall said. "We were playing a 7-0 team

on the road. That was a special game that Chief fans will remember for a long time."

The teams were scoreless until late in the second quarter. Starpoint had driven deep into Iroquois territory. The Spartans finally reached the Iroquois 3-yard line before sending on the field goal unit on 4th down.

Morgan Mariacher blocked the FG and Jordan Huber picked the ball out of the air and ran 86 yards with it.

"Our kids never stopped on the play," Marshall said. "They reacted immediately. Morgan Mariacher and Matt Whalen hustled downfield and threw some key blocks."

In the third quarter, the Chiefs took over at the Starpoint 45 after forcing a short punt. The drove down the field before reaching the Starpoint 1-yard line. Quarterback Jack Edwards snuck in for the score.

"We hang our hat on the run game this year," Marshall said, "but Starpoint really made us earn it."

Brandon Yax finished the day rushing for 156 yards on 38 carries. The rest of the team was able to rush for just

11 more yards. Iroquois gained just 23 yards passing. "The defense and special teams really stepped up and got the win," Marshall said.

Early in the 4th quarter, Starpoint drove down to the Iroquois 3-yard line with a chance to get back into the game. But a holding penalty pushed the Spartans back and then the Chiefs took over on downs.

"Our defense has played well all year, outside of one

game," Marshall said. "They have been tested in every single ball game this year."

Late in the 4th quarter, the defense added a score to put the game away.

Sophomore LB Parker Valvo intercepted a pass and returned it 42 vards for a TD and a 21-0 lead.

This was Iroquois first playoff game since the 2012 season.

"Last year, we lost out on a tie breaker," Marshall Photo by Buffalo Bills said, "and this year we got in on a tiebreaker. I'm glad the kids got to experience a play-

> off game. I was thrilled for them because they have worked so hard."

Iroquois started the season with two wins but lost three in a row, including a 48-3 thrashing from West Seneca East.

"We found out a lot about our kids," Marshall said, "and found out a lot about myself. That loss was the turning point of our season. We could have folded the tent. But, instead, we haven't lost since."

The Chiefs have now won 3 in a row, outscoring their opponents 102-20.

Marshall has been coaching in the Iroquois program for 16 years. This is his 5th year as the varsity head coach. He played high school baseball and graduated from West Seneca East in 1991. He now teaches 8th grade English at the Middle School in Iroquois

He has been married to his wife Michelle for 12 years. The couple has 2 daughters; Allie (age 10) and Madison (age 7).



Dolac has rushed for 850 yards and scored 16 TDs this fall. He has intercepted 4 passes, returning 1 for a TD.


"A lot of good players will have thousands of yards throwing or rushing," Maurino said, "but he doesn't step off the field. He has scored in every way imaginable."

Dolac has 70 tackles this season and is closing in on the career record for tackles at WSE. He has blocked 2 PATs and is averaging more than 40 yards per punt.

"He's strong," Maurino said. "He loves the weight room. He's also fast. He was timed at 4.6 in the 40-yard dash at the UB Camp."

Dolac, who also plays lacrosse, has an academic average near 90.

"He has started at MLB for 3 years," Maurino said. "We also moved him to tailback. Everyone knows he's getting the ball but he just won't go down."



Dynamic Duo Leads Ken West

Kenmore West beat Hutch Tech 49-20 last week in the first round of the Class AA playoffs. The Blue Devils led 22-14 at the half

"Hutch Tech had a couple of long drives and kept the

ball out of our hands," Kenmore West coach Rich Harris said. "That's exactly what they wanted to do."

Harris said his players were unsettled with the ball control that Hutch Tech used to keep the score close.

"Our kids were just being over-aggressive," Harris said. "We came in at the half and got everybody settled down. In the second half, we started to play our responsibilities and shut them down in the third quarter."

Kenmore West scored 21 points in the third quarter as they pulled away for the win.

"The kids played really well in the second half," Harris said. "They just completely took control."

Ken West is now 7-1 winning 7 straight games.

"None of the games have really been close," Harris said. "Our closest game was when we beat Lockport 28-14."

The Blue Devils are averaging 39 points per game this season.

Unfortunately, according to Harris, the Blue Devils have been a mere after-thought by almost everybody in WNY.

"We have 20 seniors on this team," Harris said, "and they have a chip on their shoulder. They play with an edge. The lack of respect we are getting has been a rallying point for us."

In the 2014 playoffs, Kenmore West had made it to the semifinals. They led Orchard Park with 2:50 to play but surrendered the lead and lost the game.

"We started working to get back to this point 11 months and 3 weeks ago," Harris said. "Every one of our seniors wanted to get back to this spot and make up for losing the lead against Orchard Park last year."

This season, it was thought that Kenmore West was going to be the best team in their division - and not much more has been said about the Blue Devils.

They opened the season with a 28-0 lead at Orchard Park - and basically haven't been heard from since.

"We fell off the face of the earth," Harris said. "We haven't been back in the rankings until this week."

Harris says that the entire AA North Division has been

over-looked this season.

"Niagara Falls just beat Jamestown," he said. "and Lockport gave Lancaster everything they could handle. Hopefully, our Division will start to get a little respect now. Our Division is better than what people think."

The Blue Devils will now host Lancaster at 2pm Saturday in the Class AA semifinals.

If Kenmore West is going to get past Lancaster and play for a title at Ralph Wilson Stadium, they will need a big game from Terrell Ford and DeAngelo Walker-Johnson

"We call them our Dynamic Duo," Harris said. "If Terrell isn't running it, DeAngelo is."

Ford, who starts at HB, has rushed for 732 yards this season. He has also caught 16 passes for another 367 yards.

"He's got a bunch of yards in kick and punt returns," Harris said. "He's number-1 in WNY in touchdowns."

Ford is a 4-year starter

at Kenmore West. He is now second on the career list for tackles. He set the school record for interceptions earlier this year.

Walker-Johnson, who starts at QB, has rushed for 412 yards and passed for 787 yards.

"Those two guys have not played a full football game," Harris said. "They usually spend the whole 4th quarter on the bench. You can imagine the type of yards they would have is they had played in the fourth quarter every week."

Kenmore West has not played at Ralph Wilson Stadium since 1996 - 18 seasons.

"We've been in this position 8 times in the last 11 years," Harris said. "We've had a very successful program but we haven't taken that last step. I think this year is different. We just have to take our chance and prove it this week. We're very excited about the opportunity."

Tundo said, "He does what you ask him to do. He's a great kid."


Dempsey is also listed as an OL.



Kelly (6-2, 220) also starts at H-back for the Spartans.


"We don't really play with a TE," Mammoliti said. "He plays Wing Photo by Mark Adair and FB. He can runs short routes or he can block."



Lawson (5-10, 170) is a team captain for the Warriors.



The overtime kick against East Aurora was Pastuzynski's first FG of the season.

"He's left-footed and he was on the left hash mark," Currin said. "It was a tough angle and he nailed it like it was nothing."

Alden will now host Burgard in the Class B semifinals. The Bulldogs have hosted the (other) Bulldogs in the Class B semifinals in 2010 and 2013 before this week.

"Burgard is always very good," Currin said. "That coaching staff does a great job. They are always athletic and have a lot of team speed. It will be a tough game."

most in WNY. He also has 21 TDs, which is third in WNY.

And, in the triple-overtime win last week, Grant was fantastic. He rushed 34 times for 193 yards and 3 TDs.

"He does the most when the most is needed," Currin said. "You want to put the ball in the hands of your best players. We gave our horse the ball and it ended up working out for us."

When Alden fell behind 28-21 with less than 5 minutes to play, Grant took over.

The Bulldogs started on their own 35-yard line and, naturally, handed the ball to the senior.

"He got 5 or 6 yards," Currin said, "and was completely engulfed by 4 defensive players. I stopped watching because the play was over. I heard the crowd roar, I looked up and he was 5 yards from the end zone. He just made the decision that our season was not going to end."

Grant (5-5, 175) is also enjoying a bounce-back season like the rest of the team. Two years ago, he rushed for over 1,000 yards and was a Connolly Cup finalist. But, like the team, he was forgotten by Week 5.

"It was just a matter of us not being in the big games," Currin said. "We were 4-5 and not in the playoffs. He was under the radar because we were under the radar."

Grant was a leader in the off-season workout regimen.

"He's is a very intense competitor," Currin said. "He didn't accept losing. If it's 3rd-and-3 in the 4th quarter or on Tuesday in practice. He does everything 100 percent. The off-season was no different.

Grant says that the overtime session against East Aurora was frantic.

"I have never experienced overtime in high school football," he said. "It was an intense situation. Win or go home. You really find out who the men and boys are and we got a lot of men out there."

Grant says he is looking forward to this weekend's game against Burgard.

"Burgard is always tough and super fast," he said. "Our lines will have to be physical up front."

Grant says that last season was an incredible disappointment, both as a team and personally.

"It was disappointing for our coaches, players and the school," he said. "We had not lost a regular-season game in 5 or 6 years. We opened with a loss at home and it went downhill from there."

Which is why he and the other seniors made sure the workout regimen was followed by everyone.

"It's our last chance and we knew we had to make the best of it," he said. "We worked very hard and it's paid off so far."

Grant, who has an academic average in the 90s, also wrestles for Alden. He wants to play football in college.

"I want to major in Political Science and be a police officer," he said. "I've been talking to Hobart, Colgate, and Baldwin-Wallace. I'll start looking at that stuff when the season is over."

Which, if he has his way, won't be for a few more weeks.







Mitch Thomas Leading Buff State

Buffalo State won huge game at Utica 28-16 last week as they stayed in the race for the Empire 8 championship.

"We're still in the position where we have to win them all," Buff State coach Jerry Boyes said. "Every single game, we continue to be contenders or turn into pretenders. We can't lose again if we want to make the NCAA playoffs."

Buff State is now 6-2 overall and in a 4-team race for the Empire 8 title. The conference champion will get an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

"Every game we play is a huge game," We have Hartwick. Ithaca and Brockport left. Those games will determine our fate."

In the win over Utica, BSC's special teams played a huge role.

"They fumbled a punt deep in their territory which we recovered," Boyes said. "We scored but gave it right back."

Utica recovered a Buffalo State fumble for a TD to tie the game at 7-7. In the second guarter, Buffalo State was able to down a punt inside the 2-yard line, which led to a safety and a 9-7 lead.

"We had two big plays on special teams that led to points," Boyes said. "They were just critical plays."

"It was a big day for our defense and special teams," Boyes said. "We held them to 34 yards rushing. The only way they could move the ball was through the air."

The Bengals will now play at Hartwick (2-5) in another Empire 8 game.

"If we take them lightly for an instant we'll be on the wrong end," Boyes said. "With two losses, we are not in the position to take anyone lightly."

> If the Bengals are going to run the table and make the NCAA playoffs, they will need more big games from senior DB Mitch Thomas.

"Mitch played as a freshman," Boyes said, "and he has been a 3-year starter for us."

Boves had known about Thomas since he was a star player at Sweet Home.

"We had him here when Sweet Home came to our team camp," Boyes said. "You could see that his skill set was special. His coach. John Faller recommended him highly. When John Faller recommends someone, you listen."

Thomas was named a first-team all-Empire 8 player in 2014. He was also named a secondteam all-ECAC player.

"He has been a difference-maker for us on both defense and special teams," Boyes said. "He just makes big plays at big times."

Thomas has made 130 tackles and intercepted 6 passes in his career at Buff State.

"Last year, when we beat Cortland, he blocked a PAT early in the game," Boyes said. "We kicked a FG at the end to tie the game. If he did not block the PAT, we don't have that opportunity at the end.. Those are the kind of plays he makes all the time."

Thomas has speed, according to Boyes.

"More importantly, he has those instincts that we can't teach," Boyes said. "You either have it or not. We can enhance your skill with technique and coaching. But we can't teach the type of instincts that Mitch has."

The defense would come up huge in the second half. Utica drove into Buffalo State territory twice in the third guarter. Both times the defense made goal-line stands and forced a FG.

"The defense really carried the day," Boyes said. "Utica had a 1st-and-goal at the 1 and we kept them out of the

end zone. Both of those were great stops by the defense." After the second Utica FG, Buffalo State led just 15-13, when the special teams unit struck again.

Dale Stewart returned the kickoff 100 yards for a TD. Rey Jordan had 2 interceptions in the fourth quarter as the Bengals sealed the win.


