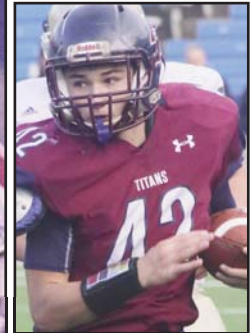

Fischer Honored for Huge Upset

Curt Fischer has been named the Buffalo Bills/ADPRO Sports Coach of the Week for his team's monumental upset of Bennett in the Class C championship game at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

MGCLake stunned Bennett - and the rest of the state - 29-28 in overtime to win the Class C title.

"I'm still kind of numb about it," Fischer said. "There was so much emotion. To see the joy on the kids faces was just overwhelming. These kids truly beat Goliath."

Nearly every person who watches high school football had Bennett as the favorite to win the New York State Championship. Bennett, a large school, was playing in Class C due to the way the state counts the BED numbers.

As a result, the Tigers rolled through their schedule, beating nearly every Class C school they played by 40 points or more.

The Tigers only loss was to AA champion Orchard Park.

"I really couldn't

be prouder of a bunch of young men," Fischer said. "A bunch of kids came together and did something that nobody thought they could. All week we said, "Shock The World" and those kids did."

Fischer was simply hoping that his team would not get humiliated. He never actually thought of winning the game... until his players were in the tunnel at 'The Ralph.'

"I looked at their eyes and I saw no fear," he said. "They had no fear in that tunnel. They wanted to do this. There was nothing on their minds but winning the game. I knew walking down the tunnel, these guys were ready."

Bennett received the opening kickoff but the Thunder Dragons forced a punt after just 3 plays.

MGCLake then took possession on their own 20-yard line and proceeded to drive 80 yards on 15 plays to take an 8-0 lead. The drive took 7:15 and Brad Benson finished it by running in to the end zone from 3 yards out.

"We script the first 15 plays," Fischer said. "We are mostly looking for adjustments that the defense makes.

We came out in an unbalanced line and we were picking up 3 and 5 and 6 yards every play."

In the second quarter, Benson bolted 40 yards for a TD to take a 14-0 lead at the half. Bennett seemed unnerved to be trailing.

"We were hoping to create some adversity for them and see how they handle it," Fischer said. "When a team rolls through their schedule like Bennett did, a lot of times, a team will start pointing fingers when things go

wrong. We wanted to put a little doubt in their mind. All of a sudden, we weren't the under-dog anymore."

Bennett scored the next three TDs to take a 22-16 lead early in the 4th quarter.

MGCLake responded with an 89-yard, 7:15 drive to tie the score. Mitch Sandberg caught a 14-yard TD pass and Benson powered in for the 2-point PAT.

Bennett came driving back to try and win the game. On 4th down from the Thunder Dragons 18-yard

line, QB Anthony Mendrysa hit Brandon Brown with a pass over the middle.

"You hold your breath every time Brown touches the ball," Fischer said. "He can go all the way at any time."

But MGCLake's Mitch Padilla tackled Brown on the 1-yard line to force the OT session.

Bennett took the ball first and scored a TD on a 4-yard run by Isaiah McDuffie. The 2-point PAT run was stuffed.

"I knew then we would kick if we could score," Fischer said.

Benson scored his 3rd TD of the game on a 4-yard run. Fischer sent in sophomore Dustin McCaslin in to kick the game-winning PAT.

"We just brought him up to the varsity 4 or 5 games ago," Fischer said. "We brought him up just to kick. We didn't kick at all before we called him up."

Fischer has coached football 29 years, the last 23 years at the varsity level. He has won 3 NYS championships in his time at Maple Grove.

Jackson to Lead Joe's against Canisius

St. Joe's beat St. Mary's 28-14 in the first round of the Msgr. Martin playoffs last week.

"It was a really strong defensive effort," coach Dennis Gilbert said. "We needed to keep (St. Mary's QB) Takal Molson from running all over the place. He is a helluva ball player and a great athlete. We contained him on all but 3 plays, which was a big key."

The Marauders will now play arch-rival Canisius in the MMA semifinals at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

"Our kids believe in what we're doing," Gilbert said. "We believe in our kids. They have a chance to go make their mark."

If St. Joe's is going to get past Canisius, they will need another big game from junior Naseer Jackson.

"He normally starts at running back and wide receiver for us," Gilbert said. "But we had to move him to quarterback against St. Mary's because we didn't have anyone else."

Jackson led the Marauders in rushing and broke away for a long TD run in the 4th quarter.

"He played very little QB for us," Gilbert said. "He played a few series against Erie McDowell when Jaylon Nelson got hurt. Naseer is a running back so he understands where the ball has to go. We need to fine-tune some of his reads but I thought he did a great job."

In the win over St. Mary's, Jackson scrambled for a key first down on a 4th-and-8 play.

"He ran around for 20 seconds and then got away for 18 yards," Gilbert said. "His ability to escape is phenomenal." Jackson is excited to play against Canisius, Gilbert said.

"He's fearless," Gilbert said. "Nothing intimidates him. He gained a lot of confidence last week, which will help him be even better this week."

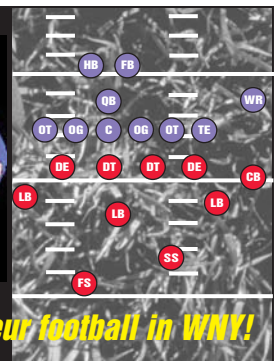
The Marauders season has been decimated by injuries this fall.

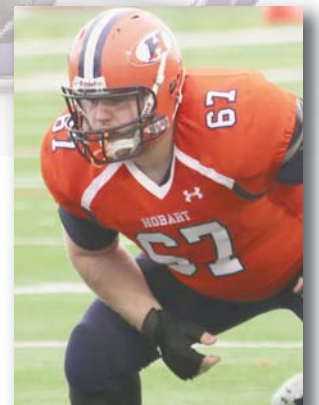

Fischer Shows Faith in His Son

MGCLake beat Bennett 29-28 in overtime to win the Class C title. The Thunder Dragons victory may be the biggest upset in WNY history.

"The odds were really against us," MGCLake coach Curt Fischer said.

"Bennett is a really stacked team. Everyone expected them to win the state title with no problem. They were built for that but we played flawless football that night."

MGCLake led 14-0 at the half but Bennett scored twice in the third quarter to take a 16-14 lead. When the Tigers scored early in the 4th quarter to take a 22-14 lead, the game appeared to be slipping away from the Thunder Dragons.

"They certainly got the momentum," Fischer said. "No doubt about it."

But MGCLake fought back and put together an 89-yard, 14-play scoring drive to tie the game at 22-22 with just 4:26 left.

"I was just hoping we could get it to overtime," Fischer said.

But Bennett wasn't done yet. The Tigers drove down to the MGCLake 3-yard line.

"It was tense," Fischer said. "But we held them on the first two plays."

A holding penalty moved the ball back to the 18. On 4th-and-goal from the 18, Bennett QB Anthony Mendrysa hit Brandon Brown over the middle.

"My heart went to my throat," Fischer said. "They have 3 or 4 kids who can break a play at any time. Brown is one of them."

But Mitch Padilla tackled Brown on the 1-yard line with just :07 left in regulation.

"We had to run a QB sneak to get the ball out of there," Fischer said.

Entering the OT, Fischer wanted to start on defense.

"I always want to play defense first," he said. "We want to see whether to play for a touchdown or if we could get into position to kick a field goal."

Honestly, Fischer said, he had already conceded a TD to Bennett. The Tigers were just too powerful.

"I expected them to score a touchdown," he said. "I thought if we could hold them on the 2-point conversion, we would have a chance to win the game with a kick."

Which, is exactly what happened. Bennett scored a TD in 5 plays but the Dragons stuffed the 2-point run.

"That was the play of the game," Fischer said. "Brad Benson made a tackle and then got some help."

MGCLake went on offense and, with the aid of a pass interference penalty, scored a TD to tie the game at 28-28.

"All the kids were yelling to kick it," Fischer said. "I had already made up my mind to kick it."

But, one problem: The Dragons long snapper Dalton Dubois had been injured earlier in the game.

"He broke his collarbone," Fischer said. "I [panicked when I realized we didn't have a snapper. I started yelling, 'Who can snap?']"

Special teams coach Jordan Saxton looked at Fischer and said simply, "Your son."

At that moment, Fischer realized what he was about to do. He sent his own son in to an overtime game at the Ralph so he could be the long snapper on the game-winning PAT.

"Kicking an extra-point is far from a given in high

school," Curt Fischer said.

And to top it all off, it would be the first varsity play for Zach Fischer, a freshman who was called up to the varsity just in case there was an emergency need for a snapper.

"What a pressure situation," Curt Fischer said, "but sometimes you have to rise up and meet the challenge."

Zach Fischer, who is just 5-foot-8 and 123 pounds, broke from the huddle and calmly fired the ball back to holder Michael Welsh. Sophomore Dustin McCaslin, who was just called up to the varsity 4 weeks ago, hit the kick right down the middle.

And the Thunder Dragons had pulled off one of the biggest upsets ever.

"It was just an awesome moment," Curt Fischer said, "not only as a coach but as a father. It was just an awesome moment."

Quakers Win AA Title

Orchard Park beat Kenmore West 34-20 last weekend to win the Class AA championship at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

“It was a good win for everyone in our program,” coach Gene Tundo said.

“Our kids were real happy with the way they played.”

The celebration was somewhat muted when the game finally ended at 12:35 am.

“I think they were trying to be respectful of Kenmore West,” Tundo said. “Our kids are pretty level-headed. We’re happy we win the section but we have more in mind.”

Orchard Park opened the scoring early in the first quarter.

The Quakers took the opening kickoff and drove 63 yards in 9 plays for the game’s first TD. Dillon Janca capped the drive when he ran in from 2 yards out.

“Kenmore West responded with a drive of its own. The Blue Devils drove 75 yards on 13 plays but a penalty

stopped the momentum and the Blue Devils had to settle for a 22-yard field goal from Sean McDonough to pull within 7-3.

The Quakers’ Josh Bernas returned the ensuing kickoff 80 yards for a TD and a 14-3 lead.

“That was a huge play,” Tundo said. “Big plays on special teams are always huge. It was a great run. He can turn it on and make a play like that at any time.”

Kenmore West scored the next 3 TDs to take a 20-14 lead at the half.

“I just thought we had to keep getting after it and playing hard,” Tundo said.

In the third quarter Janca tossed a 12-yard TD pass

to Chris Liberatore to give the Quakers a 21-20 lead. Less than 2 minutes later, OP scored again. Janca ran for another 2-yard TD to cap a 4-play, 80-yard drive.

In the 4th quarter, Kevin Koziol returned an interception 57 yards for a TD to give the Quakers a 34-20 lead.

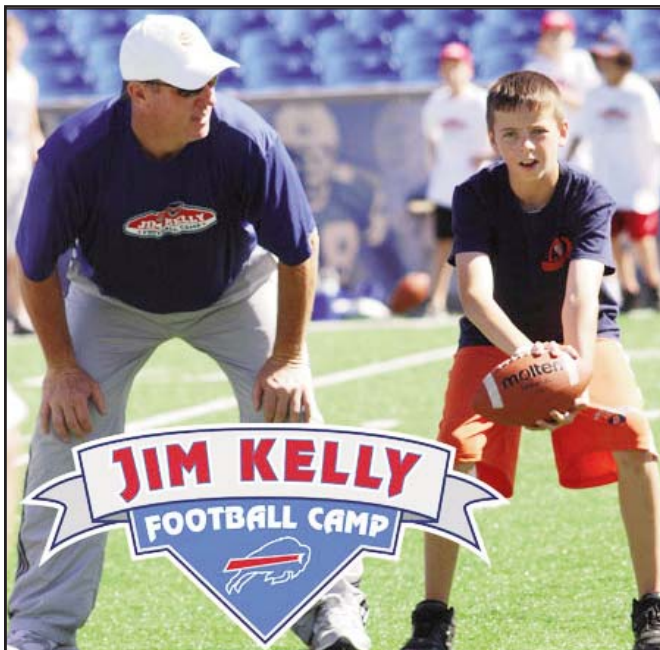

Koziol Leads Quaker 'D'

OP beat Ken West 34-20 to win the Class AA championship at Ralph Wilson Stadium last week.

"Our defense has been playing awesome," coach Gene Tundo said. "It's hard to run on us right now."

Kenmore West was able to run for just 47 total yards.

Orchard Park MLB Ronnie Shul led the defense with 12 tackles, 6 solo.

"Ronnie is so intuitive out there," Tundo said. "He was changing to outside LB, moving back inside to stuff the run. Then he would drop back 15 yards into coverage or knocking passes down. He's been fantastic this year."

Orchard Park also got a huge boost by the return of Kevin Koziol, who missed the last 4 weeks due to a sprained shoulder.

"Kevin is a great player," Tundo said. "He's a tough kid and he plays hard."

Koziol caught 5 passes for 116 yards in the win but made his biggest mark on

defense. The senior intercepted 2 passes, returning one 57 yards for a TD.

The scoring play gave Orchard Park a 2-touchdown lead with just 2:39 left in the game.

"He makes great breaks on the ball," Tundo said. "He has smarts on the field. He knows how to position himself to win the battle. He is just a gamer."

Koziol (5-11, 180) missed four games after being injured in the Quakers win at Lancaster.

"We definitely missed him," Tundo said. "He's a 2-way starter and he's good on both sides of the ball. A lot of our guys have stepped up this year but Kevin made

some special plays against Kenmore West."

Koziol, who has an academic average in the high 80s, also plays baseball.

"I think he will commit to baseball," Tundo said. "He loves to compete in anything but I think his passion is baseball."

South Park raced away from West Seneca East for a 54-30 win in the Class A championship game at Ralph Wilson Stadium last week.

"I thought we jumped on them early," coach Tim Delaney said. "Then they stormed back. The same thing happened when we played in the regular season."

The Sparks raced out to a 24-0 just :06 into the second quarter.

Tyree Brown ran for a pair of TDs and then hit Daryl Moore with an 11-yard scoring pass.

"We played really well on the big stage," Delaney said. "Everyone played well, every one shined. But Ty was really good."

The Trojans scored the next 2 TDs to pull within 24-16. John Dolac scored on a 13-yard run before Jalexis Santiago scored on an 8-yard run. Dolac ran for the 2-point PAT after each score.

"We knew they would fight back," Delaney said. "We knew they would give

us a heck of a fight."

Early in the third quarter, West Seneca East scored again. RayRay Johnson ran 32 yards for a TD to pull West Seneca East within 24-22.

Which is exactly what happened.

South Park scored 4 more TDs to pull away from the Trojans.

Austin Neal ran for a 9-yard TD before David Thomas punched in a 3-yard score, giving the Sparks a lead of 40-22.

The Trojans scored to pull within 40-30 but Brown threw 2 more TD passes to put the game away.

Brown finished the game with 16 carries for 76 yards and 2 TDs. He also completed 14 of 19 passes for 274 yards and 3 more TDs.

Sparks Center is Underrated

When South Park pulled away to beat West Seneca East 54-30 in the Class A championship game, the Sparks stars made the biggest plays. That was the mantra from the media for days after the game.

But, one overlooked South Park player, may be one of the most crucial.

Randy Bish, a senior center, has played well for the Sparks this season.

And his importance can not be understated.

"He directs the offensive line and makes all of those calls," coach Tim Delaney said. "And he is seasoned when it comes to playing in big games."

Bish, who is just 5-foot-7 and 220 pounds, is a 3-year starter for the Sparks.

"He played a little bit of varsity as a freshman," Delaney said. "We started him at center in his sophomore year."

And, while Bish may not be as big or imposing as some of the Sparks other, more celebrated, linemen, he should not be underestimated by opponents.

"He is a strong kid for his size," Delaney said. "He knows how to use his leverage. And just by his size, he will get better leverage on bigger players."

Bish is also intelligent.

"He is a smart player," Delaney said, "and he has a high football IQ. He has played football a long time and knows what's going on."

The Sparks, frankly, have several lineman who will get more press coverage than Bish.

"Really, this is the best offensive line we have ever had," Delaney said. "He is so important because he sees the defensive line and then makes the calls. Randy determines who pulls or what our pass protection will be."

And, opponents have a bad habit of underestimating him.

"Most people put their best kid at nose and make Randy go against their best kid," Delaney said. "That actually works out in our favor because Randy can handle anyone without needing a double-team."

Burgard scored on an incredible 98-yard pass play when Cordell Cain made a one-handed grab and raced all the way to the end zone.

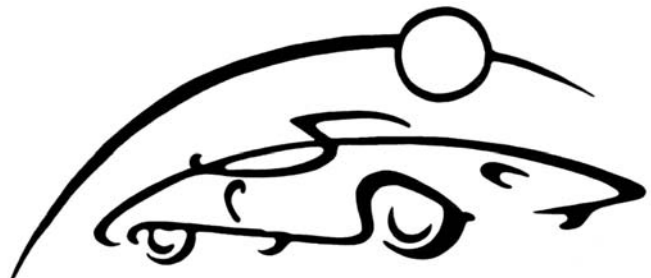

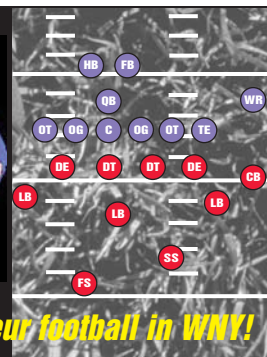

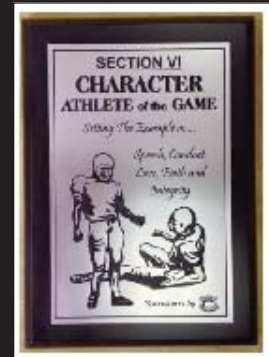

"Ronnie is so intuitive out there," Tundo said. "He was changing to outside LB, moving back inside to stuff the run. Then he would drop back 15 yards into coverage or knocking passes down. He's been fantastic this year."

Shul has recorded more than 200 tackles this season.

"He also tipped a pass that we intercepted and ran back for a touchdown," Tundo said.

Orchard Park opened the game with a 9-play, 63-yard drive to take a 7-0 lead. QB Dillon Janca ran in from 2 yards out to finish the drive.

Kenmore West responded with a drive of its own. The Blue Devils drove 75 yards on 13 plays but a penalty

stopped the momentum and the Blue Devils had to settle for a 22-yard field goal from Sean McDonough to pull within 7-3.

The Quakers' Josh Bernas returned the ensuing kickoff 80 yards for a TD and a 14-3 lead.

"That was a huge play," Tundo said. "Big plays on special teams are always huge. It was a great run. He can turn it on and make a play like that at any time."

Trailing 14-3, Kenmore West began to click on offense. The Blue Devils scored the next three TDs.

And while Ford was held to 52 yards rushing, he did catch 6 passes for 51 yards and another TD as the Blue Devils took a 20-14 lead at the half.

"Kenmore West has athletes all over the field," Tundo said. "They were on a mission and they competed hard."

Tundo said he didn't

change a lot during the intermission.

"I just thought we had to keep getting after it and playing hard," he said. "Our kids never gave up and kept playing hard. We started to get pressure on the quarterback and caused some turnovers."

And there were an inordinate number of turnovers. Orchard Park committed 5 turnovers while Kenmore West turned the ball over 7 times.

"Just one of those games," Tundo said. "We can't do that again."

With six minutes left in the third quarter, Dillon Janca tossed a 12-yard scoring pass to Chris Liberatore for a 21-20 lead. Liberatore caught 4 passes for 54 yards in

the win.

"Libertore made some great catches," Tundo said. "He was a little banged up so he didn't practice all week."

Kevin Koziol caught 5 passes for 116 yards. It was his first action in a month after he suffered a sprained shoulder.

Janca finished the game with 221 yards passing and a TD. He also ran for 2 TDs. While the stats may seem somewhat ordinary, offensive coordinator Chuck Senn says Janca played an outstanding game.

"Regardless what the stats said, Dillon was truly a leader and that was what was important," Senn said. "It was the first time all year we had really faced some adversity. Ken West played very well and challenged us. He had to make some adjustments on the fly and he did that."

Janca's numbers were also hampered by some dropped passes.

"Our receivers dropped some balls that were very catchable," Senn said. "We have to hang on to a lot of those if we want to win this week."

Orchard Park will now travel to Rochester to play Aquinas in the Far West Regionals.

"Aquinas is well-coached and competitive," Tundo said. "They have one of the most highly-recruited kids in the country, and that's pretty huge."

Aquinas is also determined to make up for a bitter disappointment in 2014, when they forfeited a playoff game they had won on the field for using an ineligible player.

"They are probably on a mission," Tundo said. "We really have to focus and play well."

If Orchard Park is going to get past the top-ranked team in NYS, it's likely that Janca will play a big role.

"He has always thrown the ball well," Tundo said, "but he's reading defenses now. He knows where to throw the ball on every play. Sometimes high school kids just wing it but Dillon is picking the right place and putting it in a perfect spot."

Senn says that Janca is a much better QB than he was in 2014, when he was a sophomore starting at the varsity level.

"He can throw screens and the deep ball," Senn said. "We can do play-action with him. He can keep plays alive with his feet. He has become a very dangerous quarterback."

Tundo said that Janca is a smart player.

"He's smart and hard working," he said. "He has great grades in school. He trains with some high-level coaches in the off-season. He loves a challenge and wants to be the very best."

If Janca does love a challenge, Aquinas would seem to be the team to provide one of the biggest challenges he will face.

"Aquinas has Division I athletes all over the field," Tundo said. "They mix things up. They are big, fast and physical all over the field. We have to win in the trenches and we have to win the turnover battle. It will be a huge challenge and our kids are looking forward to it."
